Grandview Homes Sales Office a Beehive of Activity These Days

The Grandview Palos Verdes sales office at 27781 Hawthorne Blvd. is a beehive of activity these days, with families at the rate of 15 a week moving into the completed sections, while throngs of visitors examine the 12 model homes showing the floor plans available at the new Sea Breeze section, now selling.

January sales continued brisk for the third straight weekend, according to a member of the staff of sales director William C. Kulow, who

added that while a representative selection of Sea Breeze styling and view locations are still available, their number is dwindling.

THE PENINSULA homes by Edward K. Zuckerman and Barney R. Morris are priced from \$24,660 to \$38,500, offering two bedrooms and den, three and four bedrooms and family room and two baths in 45 exterior stylings. Interior living space up to 1,824 sq. ft. is provided. Landscaping is supplied, varying with lot requirements.

A limited number of homes are available to qualified vets on VA terms. For others, long term loans are offered with down payments from \$2,450, plus costs and impounds.

SOME SEA BREEZE homes command ocean views along the great crescent of the Santa Monica Bay. From others, there are panoramic views across the city to the northeast, termed "a fairland of lights" by night.

Construction features include lathe and plaster, oak hardwood floors over continuous girders and sub-flooring with woodwork coordinated in ash, ceramic tiling in kitchens, TV jacks and 40 and 50-gallon water heaters.

HEAVY SHINGLE or rock roofs in a variety of colors are equipped with rain gutters and downspouts, as are the roofs of the double garages.

Most plans provide built-in gas ranges, ovens and roasters, and brick fireplaces with hearth and log lighter.

Adult Classes To Be Offered

Spring semester classes for adults 18 years or older will start the week of Feb. 1 according to R. E. Collins, Principal of Torrance Evening High School. Enrollment will take place at the first meeting of the class. A fifty-cent incidental expense fee is payable upon registration for students not previously enrolled.

Day and evening classes for adults offered by Torrance Unified School District include academic requirements for a high school diploma, business training, home economics, arts, crafts, shop classes, and classes in English for foreign born.

The Torrance Board of Education has authorized the use of the General Educational

Development tests (G.E.D.) for veterans and non-veterans for credit toward a high school diploma.

Students wishing to acquire a high school diploma, who have not previously completed registration forms, should contact the Adult Education office, located at Torrance High School, prior to enrolling in classes. The office will be open Monday through Friday from 9 to 4:30 p.m., and evenings to 9:30 p.m.


