

Tartar Basketball Star in Hospital

Fear Internal Infection for Bill Reinert

Bad news hit Torrance High's basketball camp this week, and prospects aren't too bright for either the Tartars or their high scoring senior guard, Bill Reinert, who has undergone hospitalization.

Reinert, the city's third top scorer with a 14.6 league average, entered the Long Beach Osteopathic Hospital five days ago for a 10 day observation.

IT IS FEARED that he has an internal infection, according to Will Boerger, Torrance basketball coach. It was not known how he received the injury.

Bill has been out of school all week, and could miss the remainder of the 1960 basketball season.

He definitely will be out for the two Torrance games this week.

"THEY'RE STILL taking tests," Coach Boerger explained. "This could be pretty bad for Bill, and it really puts a dent in our lineup," he said.

The Tartars have regained the services of center Lynn Keller, who has been sitting out the flu. Reserve guard Billy Williams has been out for the past three days with an injury, but is expected to be able to play Tuesday when the Tartars go against powerful Aviation.

IN OTHER league play Tuesday, South High (1-4) plays at El Segundo (2-3) and unbeaten Culver City (5-0) meets winless Lennox.
