Eminent Mormon Church Leader To Speak to Local Stake Officers

Two prominent leaders of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (Mormon) will address a two-day conference of the Church's Redondo Stake Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 13 and 14, in the Chapel at 2000 W. 174th St., in Torrance.

The visiting officials are Elder ElRay L. Christiansen, an assistant to the Council of the Twelve Apostles, and Elder Casper H. Parker, a member of the General Welfare Committee.

Saturday evening meetings will be for leaders of the local congregations. Sunday's general sessions, open to the public, will be held at 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Stake President L. Lloyd Prestwich of 2707 W. 182nd St. will conduct the meetings.

Elder Christiansen is president of the world-famed Mormon Temple in Salt Lake City, and former president of the Logan Temple. An educator by profession, he taught in public and Church schools and was a high school principal.

Elder Parker is a director of the famed Church Welfare Plan.

All conferences held in 1960

will focus emphasis on youth development as part of a special Church-wide parents and youth program launched early this year by Church President David O. McKay.

Conferences are held four times each year in the nearly 300 stakes (regional divisions) of the Church. Church leaders regularly tour the 50 missions throughout the world, where more than 6000 young missionaries are engaged in proselytizing activities, each paying his own expenses for a period of two to three years.

Missionary-Statesman to Speak At First Baptist Church Sunday

Dr. Oswald J. Smith, recognized as one of the world's leading missionary statesmen, will be pulpit guest at 7:30 p.m. Sunday in First Baptist Church of Torrance, 2118 Carson St., announces the Rev. Morgan Gates, pastor.

According to the Rev. Mr. Gates, the veteran preacher has ministered in 66 countries, composed over 600 hymns, and authored some 25 books with a circulation of over a million copies in nearly 30 different languages. Among his best known hymns are "Then Jesus Came," "God Understands," and "The Glory of His Presence."

Dr. Smith, who was for more than 25 years pastor of People Church, Toronto, where he is still associated, is currently devoting his major time to missionary interests and his printed page ministry which he will discuss at the local meeting when he highlights activities and reports of the world picture in missions.

The Rev. Gates says that Billy Graham is quoted as re-

While in Southern California Dr. Smith is heard each Sunday at 8 a.m. on KTLA-TV, added the Rev. Gates. He is conducting a half-hour series on "World Conquest," a news and discussion program.

Dr. Smith will be assisted in the local meeting, to which the public is invited, by the Rev. Jack McAllister, director of World Literature Crusade of which Dr. Smith is foreign secretary.
