TUESDAY Bob Weister, Bill Reinert, and Lynn Keller broke loose for high double figure scoring efforts to break open a tight 32-29 halftime score and turn the game into a one-sided rout.

The Tartars hit for 20 and 27 points in the final two quarters. The 27 point fourth quarter was the team's highest single quarter scoring effort of the season—as was the 79 total.

"REINERT GAVE us the mental lift we needed," Boerger said after the game. Reinert, a senior guard, had been out of the team for two weeks while undergoing hospital observation for a possible internal injury.

Tuesday's was his first game since the hospitalization, and his outstanding defensive and scoring performance led Boerger to comment "for a guy who's supposed to be out internally, he sure did a heck of an external job."

LYNN KELLER'S 20 point game marked his highest scoring output of his prep career.

But the Tartars have a tough row to hoe tonight. Tuesday Beverly knocked off previously unbeaten Culver City, 45-36, and the Normans clobbered Torrance in the first round.

In other games tonight, South High plays winless Lennox in Lawndale, and Culver City plays at El Segundo.

TUESDAY SOUTH walloped Chadwick of Palos Verdes in a non-league game, 64-20.

RICK JACOBS' hot shooting in the first half Tuesday sparked North to a 33-28 lead but the Saxons were ineffective the final 16 minutes.

First-string forward Sam Edwards exited via the five-personal-foul route just two minutes into the third quarter, and Hawthorne went on to rack up 26 points for a commanding lead.

JACOBS, A bespectacled junior who wound up with 22 points, hit on five of six floor shots in the first half. He totaled seven for 15, and had eight free throws.

Sophomore Sparky Davidson, a promising center, had 14 points and was the only other Saxon to hit in double figures.

The Eastern division will meet Saturday at 9 a.m. at Dominguez Field, 190th and Beryl St., and the Western division will conclude the following Saturday, Feb. 20th, also at 9 a.m., according to president Bob Simmons.

Tartars Favored As South Hosts Pioneer League

Torrance will be the favored team this evening when the Pioneer League's seven member schools send 84 wrestlers into the league finals at South High at 7 p.m.

The Tartars, with a 10-2 dual match record, and a second place trophy won recently at the El Camino Tournament, are the "team to beat" in only their fourth year of competition.

PRELIMS BEGIN at 3 p.m. in South's boys' gym. Admission for adults is 50 cents. Matches will be conducted in 12 divisions, from 98 pounds to 218.

Coached by Bill Hoag, chief championship threats from Torrance will be 98 pound Earl Yanase, 115 pound Adolph Duran, and 157 pound Dave Fiorelli.

All won their respective weight divisions at the Camino tourney.

YANASE HAS won 19 matches in a row since losing his first bout of the season. He since has reversed that decision.

Both Torrance and South are competing in the Pioneer League in their first seasons.

Top South High championship hopefuls are 115 pound Dave Vogle (157), Stan Fleener (148), 178 pound Dennis Pointon, and heavyweight Dave Birmingham. South coaches are Bob Bonheim and David Tolleson.

BIRMINGHAM, a sophomore, won the Crescent League championship a year ago as a freshman.

The 115 and 157 pound divisions should be the toughest contested, with both divisions equal to or superior to any in Southern California, according to Torrance's mat coach.

Duran of Torrance, South's Iwata, and Ed Boartz of Aviation are the top 115 pound contenders.

"Anyone" could take the 157 pound title.

MEANWHILE, North High coach Mel Nygren takes his team to Inglewood for the Bay League finals, where perennially powerful Mira Costa should again rule the roost.

Chief North weight class contenders will be Don Hyatt (163), Ed Hanchett (98) and Gary Henderson (115).

Mira Costa has won the Bay championship the past two years, and took the CIF championship last season.




