The Chessman Case

An Editorial

The latest chapter in the case of sadist-rapist Caryl Chessman proves once again that decent, God-fearing people are too prone to believe that public officials in high places will do the thing that is legally and morally right when they are called upon to make serious decisions.

Spokesmen for Governor Brown's office reported last week that mail favoring leniency in the Chessman case was running high—some said 50 to 1—when compared to mail asking the governor to follow the due processes of the law.

It appears now that the governor was unduly influenced by the amount of mail sent to him by ultra-liberal elements, fuzzy thinkers, and commie inspired do-gooders. He made the mistake that others in public office often make: He listened to the loud wails of a minority.

His incredible evasion of duty to the responsible citizens of our state should not go unchallenged. If it is statistics he wants, it is time those who are more concerned about California's moral climate than they are about a low grade criminal to write to their Assemblyman, Senator, and to the governor.

Significant changes in the tenor of the mail reaching the governor's desk has been reported already by his aides since his announcement Friday that he was granting a 60-day reprieve. He is now hearing from those Americans who do not think the antics of a communist-inspired student group in Uruguay should be considered when a matter of California law is being decided.

The governor's added announcement that he is sending the whole matter of capital punishment to the Legislature for reconsideration likewise is unjustified under the circumstances. The people, through their Legislators, have turned down eight such proposals in the past 27 years and have voted to retain capital punishment laws—as 41 of the 50 states now have.

The further precedent of bowing to pressures of a federal government bureau in the administration of state matters—even to pressures which apparently were solicited by Brown aides—is as dangerous as asking the federal government how to vote, worship, and what to read.

The reasoning advanced that Chessman has suffered cruel punishment during 11½ years on death row is about like the case of the man about to be hanged for murdering his mother and father.

His attorneys asked for clemency on the grounds that he was an orphan.


