Las Vecinas Presents Doll House to Clinic

Mrs. George Vico, Welfare Chairman for Las Vecinas reports that the doll house requested by the Mental Hygiene Clinic in San Pedro is now finished and will be presented to the clinic by her committee in the near future.

The plans for the doll house were drawn up by George Vico according to specifications of Dr. Peter J. Guzovich, psychiatrist in charge of the Mental Hygiene Clinic. He asked that it be built to look like a typical 5 room house, all on one level so that small children could easily reach every room.

Mrs. William Schuchman, a member of the Welfare committee of Las Vecinas, went to the North Torrance High school woodshop class and got permission to have one of their students make the doll house for the clinic. Fred Whitecotton, an 11th grade A student was chosen to build the doll house
