New Smog Control Bill Stronger Than Any Submitted for Study

The smog control bill which I have introduced in the Senate embraces all of the recommendations of our Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the Air Pollution Control District.

In some of its key provisions it is considerably stronger than the bill introduced in the Assembly or than the program announced by the Governor in his message calling a special session on this subject.

FIRST OF ALL, it would apply to all of the 58 counties in California, without option by county boards of supervisors to exclude a county from full compliance in a statewide enforcement program.

The other proposals would permit counties to comply only if they have determined that the smog problem within their own boundaries is sufficiently serious to warrant their participation.

In its major provisions, my own bill would do the following:

- CREATE IN the State Department of Public Health a Motor Vehicle Contaminant Control Commission of 13 members, to serve without compensations.
- Empower the California Highway Patrol to test contaminant-control devices and submit them for certification by the Commission.
- Require a contaminant-control device on all commercial vehicles and all new motor vehicles within one year after certification of such a device; within two years on used vehicles which are transferred to a new owner; and within three years on all vehicles whether transferred or not.

AUTHORIZE THE designation except for travel vehicle which are transferred to and supervision of official stations for inspection to determine the effectiveness of certified control devices installed on motor vehicles.

This last provision is also omitted from the other smog control proposals now before us.

As the area hardest hit by smog, our people in Los Angeles naturally want to come out of this session with the strongest control bill we can obtain.

IN ENACTING such a measure, however, the immediate difficulty we face is the expressed intent of many legislators from other areas to provide some basis for local autonomy, so that decisions can be made at the local level as to whether the law should apply to any particular county.

This is referred to as the "escape clause," and it may be that no statewide program can be initiated without some such provision.

In any case, an opportunity now exists, for the first time, to obtain major state action in our battle against air pollution. Any step in this direction will be a real achievement, but our desire is to take as long a step as statewide sentiment will permit at the present time.
