NEWS FROM CALIFORNIA

FIELDS AND ORCHARDS

Asparagus. A few warm days will bring a flood as asparagus to market. Supplies are gradually increasing and prices are moving down from the luxury bracket.

Brussels Sprouts about finished for the season. You'll be able to depend on supplies of fine frozen sprouts.

Carrots are usually a bargain vegetable in most markets.

Cauliflower plentiful and could continue so for some time.

Corn. The spring corn-on-the-cob crop in Coachella Valley is coming along fine . . . we won't have to wait much longer for those sweet kernels.

Some of the Kern County crop is already peeking through the ground, while some of the summer crop farther north is being planted. Signs of summer!

Lettuce is maturing in Oxnard and Orange County areas, with Oxnard planning to send in sizeable shipments.

Peas . . . fresh, green peas . . . a treat from Imperial Valley, Kern County and San Joaquin Valley. Cream some with new potatoes.

Artichokes and Broccoli . . . more soon. Cucumbers from San Diego by April.

Strawberries are about two weeks behind last year's crop, but we hope for heavy supplies by April 1.

Avocados are truly a budget buy. This recipe is known as the "Growers' Special." It comes from the McCain's in Escondido:

SEAFOOD SUPREME
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/2 cup chili sauce

1/2 teaspoon chopped pimiento
1/2 teaspoon chopped onion
1 hard-boiled egg—chopped
1/4 cup celery—diced
Salt and pepper

Blend ingredients. Fold in 1 cup tuna, crab, shrimp or lobster. Serve on avocado half shell. Yields one generous serving.
