

THE UNPROVOKED SINKING OF THE U.S.S. MAINE IN HAVANA HARBOR IN 1898 LIGHTED OFF THE SPANISH AMERICAN WAR. FIVE DAYS AFTER THE DECLARATION OF WAR, APRIL 30, 1898, COMMODORE GEORGE DEWEY CALMLY SAILED THE U.S. ASIATIC SQUADRON OF SEVEN SHIPS INTO MANILA BAY, "RIGHT UNDER THE NOSES OF THE SPANISH." DEWEY'S FAMOUS REMARK, "YOU MAY FIRE WHEN YOU ARE READY, GRIDLEY," SPURRED TOTAL DESTRUCTION OF THE SPANISH PHILIPPINE FLEET!

More Than 1000 Hear Attlee Talk In El Camino College Appearance

member of the Labor party — considered intensely radical at that time — now help form the political program of the Conservative party.

"We won't win by saying we'll have nothing to do with them," the Labor leader said of his association with rival political camps. He expressed the view that the great powers can only exterminate one another or find a way of living peacefully together. "I am for a United World," he declared, bemoaning the fact that "all our plans are upset by the scientists and engineers."

"IT'S ABOUT time to give up this fight which none of us can win," the lecturer emphasized. He cited the importance of the United Nations and its establishment in San Francisco in 1945 as a factor in achieving the kind of peace the world must seek.

To gain world peace, he suggested, nations may have to surrender some rights such as bearing arms. He likened this disarmament to the checking of individual's guns in early days of the West.

COMPARING democratic views with those of communism, the former prime minister noted, "I have a very strong faith in democracy and the Western way of life, but we must face facts . . . we have this fight . . . The Communists take all rules from one man; democracies are dependent upon many."

"It took a lot to drive you together," the speaker said of

Americans. "But you had George III!"

LORD ATTLEE spoke of the importance of opposition in the democratic form of government, of young democracies of Asia and Africa and of the importance of extending democratic concepts. He glibly accused the French of being too democratic. "They are apt to stress too much the right to change," he said.

"One of my favorite stories," Attlee recalled, "concerns a Communist agitator who was speaking to a small group of commoners on the corner of one of London's better residential streets. Pointing to a small wizened man toward the back of his audience, the Communist said, 'Brother, when the day of freedom dawns, you'll be driving that big car; you'll be living in that fancy house.'"

"But I don't want a big car or a fancy mansion," the man replied.

"Brother," the agitator retorted, "when the day of freedom dawns, you'll do as you're told!"

Among the greatest threats to democracy, Attlee said, is the "couldn't care less" attitude prevalent in many quarters.
