On next Sunday at 3 p.m. at Redondo High School Auditorium the Civic Symphony will present Gounod's opera Faust in concert form with the soloists in costume.

This is the fifth concert of the orchestra's 1959-1960 season and it promises to be one of their finest offerings. Among the players are many who have played and are playing in the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the studios and even

one from the New York Metropolitan Opera. Some are conductors of other orchestras or bands.

The orchestra is a member of the American Symphony Orchestra League, the Los Angeles County Symphony League and this concert is underwritten by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Burton Chace, local supervisor, approved by the Music Commission and they are one of the orchestras chosen, through Local 47 A.F. of M. to receive aid from the Music Performance Fund of the Recording Industries.

FAUST RANKS with the most popular and melodious operas in the modern repertoire. This gives the cast beautiful music and graceful music upon which to build their finest efforts.

Narrator for this occasion is David Bond, well-known actor, playwright, producer, and director. He is Honorary president of the Los Angeles Branch of ANTA and has appeared in many films, television shows and theaters.

sung by Joan Trona who has also appeared in many films and television shows and was heard with Judy Garland and George Jessel.

Joseph Rehard sings the part of Faust. He was recently heard in this role in Los Angeles. Mephistopheles is represented by Lyle Heck, a former soloist with the Roger Wagner Chorale. Winifred Mewborn will be heard as Siebel. She has won great popularity in local light opera roles.

ELYSE AEHLE, musical director and conductor of the Civic Symphony has had many honors and only recently received a citation from the County of Los Angeles "for her many contributions to fine music." This month she was invited by the Symphony in Malloreca, Spain, to visit them for a few weeks as guest conductor of their orchestra.
