PLAYS ENTIRE GAME ON DEFENSE

Gonta Helps South to Upset Win Over North, 13-12

On the strength of Denis Richman's perfect point-after-touchdown placement and sterling offensive performances by big Lonzo Irvin and shifty Willie Brown the South's footballing rebels upset the favored North, 13-12, in the 9th annual Shrine football game Friday evening at the Coliseum.

A crowd of 46,798 sat in on the game with all proceeds going to the Shriners' crippled children fund.

Torrance's Stan Gonta went the whole game on defense and didn't let much through his left tackle spot as he became only the second ex-Torrance High griddler to ever play in the series.

Big Ed Powell, also a tackle, helped the South to a 7-6 victory in the '54 game.

"Player of the Game" Willie Brown, the same fella who ruined North High two years ago in the CIF playoffs for Long Beach Poly, cut the North's lifeline by running a flat pass from Craig Fertig 48 yards for a touchdown to tie the count at 12-all with just 2:30 to go in the game.

The electrifying run came just 34 seconds after the North team went ahead on a perfect 11 yard rifle pass to Dave Dougan from sub-quarterback Ron Calcagno.

South's tying TD was set up by one of the few penalties in the bang-bang contest — a 15-yarder for tackling by the face mask.

That one break, plus Brown's crowd-pleasing dazzler and Richman's talented toe were the straws that broke the North's back and gave the South its first win since 1955.

El Segundo's heralded passing QB, "Pistol" Pete Beathard didn't handle a single offensive play but played virtually the full game on defense at halfback.

Peter returned the North's 4th quarter kickoff back for a good gain to set the Rebels up in business for their game-winning TD march.

The North's Jerry Neil, who served most of his duty at defensive end, was voted "Line-man of the Game" by covering sports scribes.

Neil achieved a lineman's dream on the last play of the third quarter when he snatched a Fertig bobble out of the air on an attempted pitchout and streaked 66 yards untouched down the north sidelines for a 6-6 game-tying TD.

Both the North PAT kicking attempts were blocked.

The South's first TD came on a three yard run by Irvin, who ran the ball most of the first half for the South, after a well-executed 31 yard pass-run play from Fertig to end Ken Fraser, on the first series of plays after the kickoff in the first quarter.

The annual Shrine game was preceded by a colorful Shrine pageant in which about 5000 persons participated.
