The nylon and synthetic materials and the abundance of running water, especially hot water, enjoyed by the people of America, will be two of the many interesting stories to be told by Mrs. Arpin Etyamenzian who left Thursday for her home in Amman, Jordan.

The visitor has been here for the past two months with her daughter and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Bahije Azzouni, 2728 Arlington. She arrived from her long journey on the night her granddaughter, Tanya Azzouni, was born.

While here in the States, the Jordan woman visited a sister, Mrs. Christine Dergragrossian in Massachusetts, whom she had not seen in 50 years.

Another phase of American living fascinating the visitor was the easiness with which Americans can prepare a meal. Canned and frozen foods were among the intriguing things discovered in this land of friendly people, she pointed out.

In her country, Mrs. Etyamenzian is a trained nurse and helps in the Refugee Relief center two days a week in Amman. She speaks five languages—French, English, Arabic, Armenian and Turkish. Her husband is a doctor in the Jordanian Army.

Their daughter, Mrs. Azzouni, came to America three years ago and attended El Ca-
