**Plymouth Featuring 'New Look' For '61; to Be Shown Sept. 29**

Plymouth for 1961 has a completely new look of beauty and a new ride stability, according to Von Moffett, president of DeVon Motors, 1600 Cabrillo Ave., in downtown Torrance.

Long an economy leader in the low-priced field, Plymouth in 1961 has made major engineering and styling gains in the areas of economical operation, trouble-free driving, luxury-car appearance and solid riding characteristics, he said. The design of the car is smooth and uncluttered.

THE NEW Plymouth will be shown for the first time publicly on Sept. 29 at DeVon Motors.

Harry E. Chesebrough, general manager of the Plymouth-De Soto - Valiant Division and vice president of Chrysler Corporation, had this to say about the new Plymouth styling:

"The function of a car is to move, and it should be designed with that purpose in mind. These cars will really perform, and they are designed to convey the feeling of performance at first glance. In styling, the new Plymouth has a look of solid beauty that gives it a whole new personality."

VIEWS FROM the side in silhouette, the new appearance is most pronounced. Designers have reduced the mass of the rear of the car, added to the length of the hood, and used a minimum of side trim. The new design maintains superior directional stability by keeping the center of gravity and the center of pressure as close together as possible.

There are aerodynamic advantages, which reduce wind drag, in the clean front end

styling and the smooth underbody resulting from UniBody construction. The concave design of the rear quarter panels helps to achieve stability when driving in cross winds, despite the smaller mass of metal at the rear than on previous Plymouths.

PLYMOUTH FOR 1961 offers 26 different models, five engines, four different transmissions, and 14 body colors and 30 two-tone body color combinations. In the Savoy line are two and four-door sedans with either 6-cylinder engines or V-8 engines; the Belvedere line has two and four-door sedans and a two-door hardtop, all available with either a 6 or V-8 engine; in the Fury line are a four-door sedan, a two-door hardtop, a four-door hardtop, all available as either a 6 or V-8, and the convertible, offered only as a V-8.

Nine different Suburban station wagons are offered: a two-door six-passenger car and a four-door six-passenger (6 or V-8) in the DeLuxe line; a four-door, six-passenger (6 or V-8) and a four-door nine-passenger (V-8 only) in the Custom line; and a four-door, six-passenger, and four-door nine-passenger (V-8 only) in the Sport Suburban line.

**HERE ARE some new features of the 1961 Plymouth:**

1. An alternator replaces the old-type generator, keeping the battery charging even when the car is idling in traffic with lights, radio, and windshield wiper operating. This lengthens battery life, and eliminates the "won't start" complaint on cold winter mornings resulting

2. An improved carburetor needle valve saves gas because it keeps the air-gas mixture from getting too rich. It has an anti-flood feature for easier starting.

3. A new distributor has a Nylon rubbing block at the breaker points which lasts longer and reduces the need for adjustment to maintain fine performance.

4. IMPROVEMENTS in the steering system make steering easier.

5. New quiet-cushioning action built into the shock absorbers makes the ride even quieter.

6. New longer-lasting tires are squeal-resistant and help eliminate noise by lowering the road hum level. Life of the tread has been increased by 15 per cent.

7. The uni-body construction has been further refined through more precise manufacturing methods and is even more solid and quiet.

8. A NEW magnetic drive in the speedometer operates more quietly by eliminating gear noise resulting from metal-to-metal contact.

9. The starting system has a new solenoid shift which is quieter and longer wearing.

10. Brakes are more durable and smoother. They use Chrysler Corp.-built Cycleweld linings.

11. The new parking brake is safer, more difficult for children to release accidentally. It requires less pressure for secure holding and is in a location which makes it easier to apply.

12. Inner construction of seats is stronger, and there is extra cushioning to the center section of the rear seat, for added passenger comfort.
