Play Director To Participate In Rec Congress

Harry B. Van Bellehem, director of recreation, Torrance Recreation Department, will take a prominent part in the 42nd Annual National Recreation Congress in Washington, D. C. He will act as recorder at the session, "Springboards to Community Action".

The theme of the Congress, to be held September 25th through the 29th at the Shoreham Hotel, is "Recreation in America Today and Tomorrow".

More than 2000 volunteer and professional recreation workers are expected to attend to discuss all phases of recreation and leisure time from programming of facilities.

Subjects discussed will include such topics as Reaching the Hard to Reach Youth, Using Science Projects in the Recreation Program, and Recreation in Faith-Oriented Community Centers.

County Labor Group Backing Proposition 15

The Los Angeles County Federation of Labor, AFL-CIA, representing 300 affiliated unions with 800,000 members, has endorsed Senate re-appointment, Prop. 15, Secy. William J. Bassett announced yesterday.

In a statement issued by the Committee for Senate Re-appointment, Yes on 15, Bassett declared the labor organizations would conduct vigorous campaigns to assure adoption of Prop. 15 at the Nov. 8 general election.

"WE ARE delighted by the action of the 1200 delegates representing every segment of labor in Los Angeles County," he stated. "We are confident that Prop. 15 will be adopted by an overwhelming majority of the people when they are fully advised of its importance."

"Once labor knows that any labor or progressive legislation can be and frequently has been killed by the votes of cow county senators, labor's 'Yes' vote on Prop. 15 will insist on equal Senate representation for all parts of the state."

BASSETT, pointing out that labor has always championed equality in voting, said the members of the federation's executive board "were shocked to learn that some unions have associated themselves with reactionary groups in opposing reappointment."

A committee will be formed immediately to conduct the campaign in behalf of Prop. 15 throughout Southern California," he stated.

Shell Executive Tells of More Expansion Plans

New developments in Shell Chemical Co.'s plans to triple plant capacity for the production of polyisoprene, the man-made equivalent of natural rubber, were revealed today by J. P. Cunningham, general manager of Shell Chemical Company's Synthetic Rubber Division, at Torrance.

IN ADDITION to the completion of the expansion program this year at Torrance, raising that plant's capacity to 40 million pounds per year, Shell Chemical is acquiring a site 15 miles west of Marietta, Ohio, on the north bank of the Ohio River. Closure of the plant purchase is contingent upon a title search which is being expedited at the moment.

The new multimillion dollar plant to be constructed on this site will have an annual capacity of 80 million pounds per year of polyisoprene, and will employ 250 persons.

CUNNINGHAM SAID that construction is scheduled to begin soon with the plant expected to be on stream by late 1961. Plans for construction of the plant are in progress by the C. F. Braun and Ralph M. Parsons Companies.

Petroleum derived feedstocks for the new installation will be obtained from Shell Oil Company's Wood River, Ill., refinery.

The Shell product is called Shell Isoprene Rubber and goes into a variety of end products. The new synthetic can be used virtually wherever natural rubber is used because it is chemically the same as natural rubber. However, scientifically controlled production gives it a uniform quality not found in the tree-grown variety.

Remove UN From States, Says Coffee

Tom Coffee, 17th Congressional nominee, has called for the removal of the United Nations headquarters to some politically isolated location such as Bermuda, Switzerland, or the Azores.

Speaking at the Westchester Toastmasters Club, Coffee stated that, "Khrushchev and his cut-throat gang have captured the UN as a Communist propaganda forum and are now showing their first spectacular. After denying President Eisenhower entrance into Soviet Russia and into Japan, Khrushchev now struts into Manhattan like a conqueror, staging a Communist convention such as has never been seen before."

Study Proposal To Let Fireman Register Voters

Study of a plan under which each county fireman would be deputized as a registrar of voters and each county fire station as registration center was ordered this week by the county Board of Supervisors on motion of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

There are 107 county fire stations located throughout Los Angeles County.

"I believe that this plan, if determined to be feasible in Los Angeles County, would be a great convenience to the public at no additional cost to the taxpayers," Supervisor Hahn declared.

HE EXPLAINED that two counties—Ventura and Alameda—have the system and find it very successful.

"Many times people wishing to register to vote have to make a number of inquiries before they are able to learn where they should go to be registered. With this plan in operation, everyone would know that they could register to vote at any time at any county fire station," Supervisor Hahn said.

IT WOULD BE a simple matter to provide each fireman with the training needed to

administer the oath and secure affidavits of registration and the fee paid by the county for each registration could be used by the fire department personnel when they are off-duty but on call at the stations, he added.

On his motion, the Board of Supervisors instructed Registrar of Voters Benjamin S. Hite to confer with County Fire Chief Keith Klinger to see if the program could be worked out.


