


CROSSWORD PUZZLE

Church School Bus Drivers Go To Safety Class

The South Bay Community Christian School is sponsoring a student and public protection program. Principal Thurman Winkel announced he has secured Charles Deck, formerly with County Civil Defense and an American Red Cross First Aid Instructor, who is donating his services to conduct a class on Thursdays at 2:15 p.m. starting immediately at the school located at 5922 Pacific Coast Hwy., Hollywood Riviera.

All of the bus drivers in the South Bay Community Christian School are taking the course together with others from the public who wish to at-

tend. American Red Cross First Aid certificates will be given the graduates.

Deck says he is including various aspects of civil defense in the course together with the first aid and has considerable literature for the students on these subjects furnished by Capt. Joe Rochefort, co-ordinator for the Area Civil Defense, and George Powell, Torrance City Civil Defense, as well as first aid materials and charts from the American Red Cross.

Motion pictures, class instructions and demonstrations will also be used.

Principal Winkel said he will insist that all our bus drivers be graduate first aid men ready to give first aid in an emergency. He says all of the bus drivers are anxious to couple knowledge for protection with the excellent safety record which is emphasized at all times.

New Filmstrip On Traffic Now Ready at Shell

The third 35 mm filmstrip in a series designed to sharpen the ability of motorists to spot traffic hazards has been released by Shell Oil Co.

Titled "Perception of Driving Hazards - Part III - Highways and Byways," the new training aid pictures hazards on ordinary highways and secondary roads.

ALL THREE filmstrips are offered to high schools, corrective driving clinics, industrial fleets and safety organizations, and are intended primarily to supplement conventional driving training.

The first part of the series is concerned with hazards found on city and suburban streets, while the second filmstrip shows traffic problems on high speed freeways and highways.

All three were designed by New York University's Center for Safety Education under a Shell grant, and involve a "flash-screen" technique of showing actual traffic scenes as seen from the driver's seat.

THE NEW technique is part of a broad research program conducted by the Center for Safety under a Shell grant, and is one phase of Shell's own comprehensive safety education program.

Governor Adds Backing to Fight For San Diego Freeway Project

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced this week that Governor Edmund G. Brown has taken a personal interest in expediting the allocation of \$25 million needed for completion of the San Diego Freeway between Jefferson Blvds. and that this gives strong encouragement to hopes that the "missing link" will be under construction in time to be opened by the fall of 1962.

In a letter to Supervisor Hahn, Governor Brown stated: "I am sure that Mr. Robert B. Bradford, chairman, and the other members of the California Highway Commission concur with me that completion of the San Diego Freeway in the vicinity of the International Airport is of the utmost importance in providing satisfactory traffic service for the large surrounding area."

The Governor added that "the Division of Highways' staff in Los Angeles, under the direction of Mr. E. T. Telford, Assistant State Highway Engineer, is making a concentrated effort to complete the detailed plans and acquisition of rights of way from 174th St. to Jefferson Blvd. in order that these projects will be ready for construction just as soon as funds can be made available."

New Overpass Gaining Monopoly on Crossing

Students at South High School are using the overpass for all crossings made over busy Pacific Coast Hwy. now, according to Principal John Lucas.

This plan was put into operation to forestall any accidents on the highway, even though there is a stop light at Calle Mayor.

GOVERNOR BROWN'S letter was in response to a letter which Supervisor Hahn wrote to him a few days after a large contingent of Torrance and South Bay civic leaders and public officials went to Sacramento to urge the State Highway Commission to allocate the money to construct the "missing link." At that time, Hahn conferred briefly with Brown about the importance of expediting the San Diego Freeway construction program.
