The previous Ram record was 47 yards by Bob Waterfield in 1948 against the Pitt Steelers and in 1951 against the Cleveland Browns. The ams have intercepted four passes in the first two


games, quite an improvement over last year when they stole 7 in 12 league games.

## Double Championship Points Offered for Riverside Race


