## Two Tartars Honored for Rating In National Merit Scholarships

Two seniors at Torrance High School have been honored for outstanding performance on the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) given last spring. Each student who is endorsed by his school receives a formal Letter of Commendation signed by his principal and the president of the National Merit Scholarship Corp.

Dr. Carl R. Ahee, the school's principal, has announced that the commended students are Jon George Lehr and John Michael Orr.

"Letters of Commendation are being awarded to some 28,000 students throughout the United States in recognition of their excellent performance on the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.

"WHILE THESE bright youngsters did not reach the status of semifinalists in the 1960-61 Merit Program, they are so outstanding that we wish to single them out for special attention. The semifinalists and commended students together constitute less than three per cent of all high school seniors, and this certainly signifies noteworthy achievement.

The National Merit Scholarship Corp. gives recognition to two groups of students who achieve high scores on the NMSQT. The semifinalist group is composed of the highest students in each state and in United States territories. Some 10,000 semifinalists will take a second examination in December to establish further their eligibility to receive Merit Scholarships.

"THE LETTERS of Commendation provide tangible recognition of the commended students' high ability," Ahee continued. "It is our earnest hope that the recipients will continue their education, and thus benefit not only themselves but also the nation.

"The Merit Program has several objectives. One is the selection of Merit Scholars from among the semifinalists. However, we also strive to foster the pursuit of excellence among all highly able students. We urge the students honored today to make every effort to attend college, and to develop to the fullest their promise of achievement."

THE COMMENDED students

were among the high school juniors in more than 15,000 schools who took the NMSQT last spring. The test is a three-hour examination which covers five separate areas of educational development. It was the first step in the sixth annual Merit Program.

This year's program will conclude about May 1, 1961 with the naming of students who will receive four-year Merit Scholarships to the colleges of their choice.

The commended students and the semifinalists who do not win Merit Scholarships are considered for certain other scholarships which are offered through the facilities of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

THE ANNUAL Merit Scholarship competition is open to all high schools in the United States and its territories. Approximately 3,200 Merit Scholars are currently enrolled in about 400 colleges and universities. About 500 Merit Scholars have been graduated.

Scholarship awards are made from the resources of the National Merit Scholarship Corp. and through sponsoring corporations, foundations, associations, and individuals.
