

'Civil War' Titanic Rated Tossup

Injury Bug Bites Both Teams; 5000 Expected Friday

A brand new North-South athletic rivalry will explode into full reality tomorrow night when the two football teams collide in a key Bay League game at Saxon Stadium in North Torrance.

School officials are anticipating an overflow crowd of about 5000 for what is shaping up as a do-or-die "battle for the infirmity."

North (1-1) and South (0-2) are both seriously injury riddled, with key players on both sides shelved or doubtful for the big "civil war" game.

Odds makers are rating it a toss-up, although North is a Bay League "veteran" of two seasons now and South—in its first Bay campaign—has dropped two in a row, last week to Redondo 26-19.

Only slotback Felix Allvillar holds over in the Saxons' starting backfield alignment.

Jeff Bell will start at quarterback, Mike Cox at fullback, and Bob Moore at left half. North's big and touted interior line has somehow managed to stay healthy—even after last week's upset 13-7 loss to Morningside—and will remain the same.

Regular starters Cary Hubert (QB), Rick Jacobs (FB) and spunky halfback Roy Dohner are questionable, still nursing wounds. Their inactiveness could also cripple the Saxons' pass defending secondary.

SOUTH IS just about in the same physical condition, although all the Spartans' regular first string will be suited up.

Veterans Joe Austin and Bob Wehrhan headline a dual run-pass scoring threat. Both are all-Pioneer Leaguers.

Their favorite passing target is lanky end Mike Andrews,

who has grabbed 12 passes in three games for 193 yards.

However, Wehrhan's contribution to the team which last year knocked off Torrance High 27-14 in Torrance's first intra-city hookup is questionable.

The power driving senior did not scrimmage this week, resting an injury.

Austin, and lineman Roger Harrold and Dave Birmingham are also waiting out the effects of injuries suffered in the Redondo tilt.

COACHES Bob Shoup (North) and David Tollefson (South) look for a high scoring game, with each able to score through the air when necessary.

North's Hubert to end Pat Lininger combination has clicked for three TDs in three games. All told, Lininger has 25 points to his credit.

Hubert, despite a bad ankle, hit on eight of 13 flips last week. He has completed 21 of 32 pass attempts for the season.

Bell, who'll start, is a junior with good poise. He's a fair passer and is termed a real good faking quarterback by his coach.

Tomorrow's battle will be only the second scheduled North-South varsity encounter in their athletic histories. Last spring the baseball Saxons—under the same Bob Shoup—whipped South 7-0.

Cee Teams Kickoff Grid Rivalry Today

A lightweight Class C football game will kick-off the week's intra-city grid rivalry between North and South high schools today at 3 p.m. Unbeaten North goes up against the host Spartans (1-1) in a Bay League tilt to be followed up tomorrow

at 3 p.m. with what promises to be a slam-bang Bee crucial.

Friday, South will try to snap North's consecutive win string at 12 in attempting to rebound from a 25-6 loss to Redondo last week.

North, defending league

champs, hasn't been scored upon in three 1960 tilts.

If the Saxon Bees win tomorrow they'll probably go against a similarly unbeaten Redondo eleven next week. Meanwhile, South has lost only two Bee games in two seasons.

North Can Seat 4800

South High rooters—in order to sit in the Spartans' northside rooting section, must enter Saxon Stadium from the northern entrance tomorrow night, according to school officials.

Seating for about 4800 persons will be provided. About 700 bleacher seats have been placed in the end zone for the intra-city tussle.


