Monarchs Favored by 13 Friday

Phil Fish Injured; Out For Season

Morningside High, fresh from an explosive 38-32 victory over intra-city rival Inglewood and with four straight wins under its belt, will roll into Torrance High's football stadium tomorrow night to meet South's underdog Spartans at 8 p.m.

The speedy Monarchs are a 13 point odds-on favorite to extend South's longest win drought since 1956 to four games.

The Spartans have lost to Bay League opponents Hawthorne (13-0) and Redondo (26-19) and tied rival North, 13-13, since winning their season opener against Dominguez, 21-7.

ALTHOUGH ace backs Bob Wehrhan and Joe Austin are both back in A-1 shape, the Spartans' offensive spark will be undeniably doused with the absence of right halfback Phil Fish from the line up.

A 165 pound sophomore who scored both his team's touchdowns against North, Fish learned he'd have to sit out the rest of the season, with a damaged left kidney, this weekend.

It was injured in the third quarter of the North game. Phil, one of the school's brightest young athletic prospects, was hospitalized about midnight Friday after the injury became noticeably severe.

He'll be on his back for about two weeks, according to South Coach David Tollefson.

The right halfback spot was thrown wide open between Warren Cross (160), a senior transfer from Colorado, and Dave Garrison (165).

ONE OTHER Spartan is still waiting out an injury—right guard Roger Harrold.

South has scored just one touchdown in the second halves of four games. The Spartans have totaled 53 points while giving up 59.

Morningside's record has indicated the Monarchs are getting stronger week by week.

Running out of a spread-T, the Monarchs racked up nine touchdowns in three Bay League tilts.

Friday's will be the first football meeting ever between the two schools.

Thornton Drops Cross Country Record at THS

Mike Thornton and Tony Bareford were both under the school's 1.8 mile course record as Torrance's cross country team remained unbeaten in dual meets with an 18-45 triumph over Beverly Hills at Torrance Friday.

Thornton lowered his own mark by five seconds as he zipped in in 8:48 while Bareford was clocked in 8:53.

Torrance also took the JV meet, 15-64 and won the novice division, 17-48.

Saxons Shakeup Line-Up For Leuzinger Tussle

Four new faces may be in North High's starting line-up tomorrow night when the Saxons take on what they hope will be a Bay League "breather" in winless Leuzinger.

Coach Bob Shoup has indicated that tackle Fred Furnace, guard Sam Pierce, end Dan Claxton and fullback Mike Cox may earn starting jobs against Leuzinger.

Game time is 8 p.m. in Lawndale. Cox, a 150 pound junior who started against South High last week, was a 4th stringer at the beginning of practice this fall.

But his progressive play, hustle and faking abilities have

earned him a first string spot over letterman Rick Jacobs.

After losing 13-7 to Morningside then playing to a 13-13 tie with South, the Saxons, 2-1-1 on the season get their first chance to experiment tomorrow night for the last three weeks of the Bay League season.

North will meet defending champion Hawthorne, so far unbeaten Redondo, and Mira Costa in that order before closing the door on the '60 campaign.

The Saxons are solid 19 point odds-on choices to hand Leuzinger its 6th straight defeat.

Entries Pour In for Open Golf Tourney in Gardena

Entry applications are pouring into the offices of the officials for this year's Seventh Annual Gardena Valley Western Ave. Open Golf Tournament in response to more than 800 invitations which were sent to professional and amateur golfers throughout the Southland.

The tournament, which will be held at the Western Ave. Country Golf Course (12009 South Western Ave., Los Angeles) Nov. 10-13 is sponsored by the Gardena Valley Kiwanis Club in conjunction with the Western

Ave. Men's Club and the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation.

It is expected that more than 300 golfers will enter the four day tourney, teeing off for the \$6,000 purse which tournament officials are offering to the winner.

Professional golfers' entry fee has been set at \$15; amateurs will be charged \$12.50 to enter.

Proceeds obtained from the tournament will be used to promote various programs and undertakings for the general over all community welfare, say tournament officials, with much of the money going to establish and further youth programs, activities, and scholarships.

The tournament, which has become a tradition in the Gardena Valley area, was first played in 1954. Since that year, it has drawn larger and larger groups of contestants and the purse has been increased from its original \$2,500 to the \$6,000 which will be awarded this year.

A list of tournament winners over the years include Bob Duden, Smiley Quick, Tommy Jacobs, and Jerry Barber.

Bakersfield Favored Over Vikings; El Cam. Tackles SMCC Friday

At least one of the Metropolitan Conference's three unbeaten football teams will stumble this weekend as defending Junior Rose Bowl champion Bakersfield challenges Long Beach City College in the northern city in a game which will attract national attention Saturday night.

Tomorrow night, our own El Camino Warriors invade Santa Monica's lions den at 8 p.m. in another Metro crucial.

SANTA MONICA is 5-0 while Coach Norm Verry's Warriors are 2-3 after last week's 28-22 win over Valley JC.

Last year El Camino upset Santa Monica to end a 16-game victory string.

Santa Monica, a 12-point favorite is led by hard hitting fullback George Hughley, who's accounted for 42 points in the Corsairs' five wins.

El Camino's top offensive threat is the Ron Veres to Paul Burleson passing combination which has hit the scoreboard four times this season.

Burleson leads the Warriors in scoring with 28 points.

BUT THE BIG one locally, and nationally, will be fought Saturday night.

Bakersfield and Long Beach are 1-2 in national rankings and both sport 5-0 season records. However, off comparative scores, Bakersfield will be favored by two touchdowns.

In this series, which began in 1930, Bakersfield holds a 12-6-2 bulge. The Renegades have won six of the last seven meetings.

Torrance Guns For Falcons in Pioneer Biggie

A couple of three game winning streaks will go, on the line tomorrow night when Torrance High and Aviation collide in the Pioneer League's featured game of the year in North Redondo at 8 p.m.

And once again it's put-up or shut-up time for Torrance, which will be a slight underdog to the defending champion Falcons.

If Aviation wins, the Falcons will have a virtual open door to their second straight title and the CIF "AA" playoffs, with only two doormats yet to brush off before the season is over.

Torrance, on the other hand, is in a do-or-die situation, with the meat of the Pioneer League schedule coming up.

IF THE TARTARS lose this one, they may as well kiss the season good-bye, despite two successive snow jobs of the league's weak sisters.

Since a 6-0 loss to Redondo and a 19-6 triumph over Inglewood in non-league tussles, Torrance has exploded for successive 39-7 and 47-6 victories over winless Lawndale and Beverly Hills.

Aviation has upended El Segundo (14-0), Culver City (13-6), and Lennox (13-0) in order. The Falcons once again are carrying their tough-as-nails defensive trademark which has carried the team to eight straight league triumphs.

Aviation shutout Torrance 6-0 last year in Tartar Stadium. Both teams are rated stronger in '60.

Torrance's first big injury of the season may sideline starting slotback Allan Billings (5-10, 175) for this one. Billings broke his nose in practice Tuesday night when he was kicked in the face during conversion practice.

HOWEVER, he may be fixed up with a special face mask, depending on the advice of doctors. Seniors Dave Woodward and Mike Challis will spell him at the slot spot.

Otherwise, Torrance's offensive unit will remain the same. Tartar Coach Irwin Kasten is hoping his defensive alignment, which has yielded just three touchdowns in four games, can stop Aviation's two top backs, Earl Thompson and Dennis Hearn, who've scored 52 of Aviation's 74 points.

If the defense can't contain them then another Tartar bid for a first major varsity sport championship will go down the drain.

Torrance High hasn't won a football title since 1946, when it was still in the Marine League of the Los Angeles City School System.
