

## Improvement of Lomita Blvd. in Harbor City Area Gets Go Ahead

Full improvement of Lomita Blvd. from Normandie Ave. to Western Ave. and additional land for the Harbor City Playground has been assured by a tri-corner public officials' agreement.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace, acting on a request from City Council President John S. Gibson, has tentatively approved \$76,000 county appropriation to augment a \$63,900 city appropriation to provide for acquisition and improvement along the north side of Lomita Blvd. through both city and county territory.

**FOLLOWING** A County Road Department report, indicating the extensive use of this boulevard (more than 10,000 cars use this route daily), which links two sections of county territory, Supervisor Chace declared it to be of general benefit to all residents of the area, and informed Councilman Gibson that he was happy to participate in this highly desirable improvement.

As soon as proper agreements can be worked out, work orders will be issued for the acquisition of several parcels of land, and for removal of several residences and business structures.

**WHILE ONLY** a portion of


the land to be acquired will be needed for the roadway improvement, it now is proposed to purchase the entire frontage property between Flampton and Belle Porte, with the unused portion then to be converted into the Harbor City Playground site. As a result of the tri-corner agreement, the city's Recreation and Parks Department will reimburse both city and county funds for the playground area.

Completion of the improvement along the south side of Lomita Blvd. between Normandie Ave. and Western Ave. is expected to go to contract before the end of the year, according to Councilman Gibson. Acquisition has been completed for 30 of the 34 parcels required for this improvement.

**THIS NEW** agreement will provide for a continuation of the project started several years ago by the county west of Western Ave. and in a joint city-county project between Avalon Blvd. and Wilmington Blvd. in the Wilmington area.

At the same time, tentative arrangements were made for the continuation of this full-scale improvement through Wilmington. It is expected that partial improvement of several Wilmington sections will be fi-

## Residents Seek Street Light Work

"Petition for installation of street lights on 230th, 231st, 232nd, and Martinshire Sts., just westerly of Figueroa St., has been sent to Mrs. Robert Gibson of 626 230th St.," Supervisor Burton W. Chace announced. The proposed street lighting system will use ornamental steel poles with overhead wiring.

Chace stated that if Mrs. Gibson succeeds in securing the signatures of at least 60 per cent of her neighbors and returns the petition to the Road Department before Nov. 15th, it will be possible to annex this subdivision to the Dolores Lighting District and order the street lighting system installed about July 1st of next year.

Chace urged the residents of this area to contact Mrs. Gibson and sign the petition if they wish to have modern residential street lighting.


