### Jackie Nixon Wins Homecoming Crown for El Camino College

Miss Jackie Nixon, 18-year-old coed, will reign as Homecoming Queen of El Camino College following her selection Tuesday evening by a panel of seven judges.

One of eleven candidates for the campus honor, Miss Nixon will be crowned at a Homecoming Rally to be held in the Campus Center at 11 a.m. Nov. 10. Her princesses will be Miss Thelma Mann and Miss Nancy Wilkie.

THE TRIO of coeds will again be honored at the El Camino-East Los Angeles College football game Nov. 12 in Murdock Stadium. They will lead the parade of floats which will form a procession around the field in pre-game ceremonies starting at 1 p.m.

Selection of Miss Nixon was made at the traditional Queen's dinner in the college Campus Center. Following the dinner hour, each of the eleven coeds

was introduced individually to judges, who conducted interviews with the crown aspirants. Personality, poise, leadership, charm and scholastic achievement and aspirations were among factors considered by the evaluation team.

MAKING the final selection were John Moon of Manhattan Beach; Mrs. Stuart E. Marsee, wife of the college president; Walter Becker of Gardena, former student president at El Camino; John Ramsey of Inglewood, the "Voice of the Dodgers"; and an alumnus of the college; the Rev. Paul C. Cox, pastor of St. Andrews Presbyterian Church of Redondo Beach; and Mrs. Lillian Browning, a fashion consultant and student of the college.

The 1960 Homecoming Queen is a resident of Gardena and is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Nixon, 420 E. 87th Way, North Long Beach. A member of Delta Sigma Chi sorority, she is active in stu-

dent government on campus. She is a member of the college scholastic honor society, Alpha Gamma Sigma, and serves as secretary of the student council.

MISS NIXON is majoring in elementary education and is a graduate of Covina High School.

Interviews following which the queen and her princesses were named were continuous throughout a period of more than three hours. Judging was reported so close that each candidate appeared before the panel three times.

Miss Mann, 18-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hershel K. Mann of 44 Strand, Hermosa Beach, is a secondary education major and a graduate of Redondo Beach Union High School. She has been commissioner of athletics, court bailiff, a member of the Associated Women Student board and commissioner of athletics at El Camino. She has also been

active in theatrical activities on campus.

PRINCESS Wilkie, 19, resides in Inglewood, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Slymen, she is a graduate of Washington High School and a major in art education. She was secretary of the freshman class and is a member of Alpha Gamma Sigma, honor society, and commissioner of public relations on the student council.

Among the guests present for the selection dinner were Hilar K. Ashley, president of the college Board of Trustees, student, faculty and administrative representatives.

Miss Nixon succeeds Miss Linda Axenty, former Redondo Beach resident now preparing for a teaching career in journalism at San Jose State College.

Chairman of the Queen's dinner was Miss Mary McCoy, who served as mistress of ceremonies, Co-chairman of Homecoming are Bob Barker and Miss Pat Stevers.

### Annual May Co. Scout Jamboree Set for Sports Arena on Nov. 26

Scouting's biggest show—the May Co. Jamboree—will play to the largest audience in its history on Saturday, Nov. 26, at the Sports Arena.

Traditionally held during February at Shrine Auditorium, the increasingly large crowds at the show forced its move to the Sports Arena.

Nearly 30,000 Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts will witness the spectacular at morning and afternoon shows.

Tickets to the show are now available at any May Co. store. They are free, but an official Scout registration card must be shown for every ticket requested. Only Cubs and Scouts in

uniform will be admitted to the Sports Arena.

A special feature of the May Co. Jamboree this year will be recognition of approximately 5000 Cubs and Scouts who hold "Golden Key Recruiter" awards.

### Meadowpark Gets 9 New Classrooms

Opening of nine new classrooms at Meadow Park Elementary School will virtually eliminate double sessions at that heavily crowded school, the Board of Education was told Tuesday night. Classrooms will be ready on Monday, Nov. 14.

Area parents attending the meeting were told their problems with double sessions soon would be relieved.

Nearly 1400 students from the Meadow Park area and from the Cictor Tartc area are enrolled at the school. Twenty classes currently are on double session there. Opening of the new facilities will eliminate the problem.

STUDENTS from the Victor Area are attending Meadow Park until a new elementary school in that area is completed next year. It currently is under construction.

At the same time, the board approved a waiver of the attendance area of Meadow Park which includes a 192-home subdivision now under construction. These students will attend Calle Mayor School, which is less crowded, for this year, under the action.

It was indicated that this will be a temporary arrangement and changes would be made in the future. The board currently is purchasing two school sites to serve the Walteria Lake area where the 192-home development and others are slated in the future.

### Groups to Seek Truce in Tiff Over Dance Site

School officials, representatives of the Southwest Park Civic Assn., and residents of the Steele and Flavian School areas will get together to iron out problems concerning use of the two schools for dances. "Pat" Hogue of the Southwest Park group asked for reconsideration of action denying his organization use of the two schools for dances. He appeared at the Board of Education meeting Tuesday night.

Reasons cited by school officials for denial were damage to school property and complaints by neighbors about the dances. All interested parties will get together and try to settle the matter, it was agreed, after residents at the meeting denied the school's contentions.

### Shell Lecturers To Visit School Classes of Area
