

Veterans' Day Rites Slated By Supervisors

A brief ceremony will be held at 11:45 a.m. today at the County Hall of Administration commemorating Veterans' Day on Friday and dedicating a plaque which has been placed there in memoriam to County employees who died in the World Wars and in Korean conflict.

Norman Kelly, director, Military and Veterans Affairs, and Ray Rayland, Adjutant, Los Angeles County Post 810, American Legion, will serve as co-chairman for the dedication program.

THE SERVICES will be preceded by a short concert by the 72nd United States Army Band from Fort MacArthur.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, chairman of the only veteran on the Board, will deliver the main address.

The invocation and benediction will be given by Reverend Joseph D. Ewers, Chaplain, Department of California, United Spanish War Veterans. Pledge of allegiance will be led by Robert B. Elliott, Commander, Justice Post 575, American Legion.

DISTINGUISHED guests will be introduced by County Counsel Harold W. Kennedy, while Kelly will introduce members of the Board of Supervisors.

Wreath for the plaque will be presented by the Guard of Honor, Star Post 309, American Legion.

Diabetes Test Clinic Slated Here on Nov. 17

To find the one in 70 Angelenos who has diabetes and doesn't know it, the Diabetes Assn. of Southern California is offering free tests at 37 testing centers throughout Los Angeles County during Diabetes Week, November 13 to 19.

With the cooperation of civic groups like the Junior Chamber of Commerce and at least 25 Womens' Clubs, screening centers will be open one day in each area.

The Torrance clinic will be held at the Torrance Women's Club, 1422 Engracia Ave., on Thursday, Nov. 17, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

According to the association detection committee chairman, Dr. Roberta Armstrong, "undiscovered and undetected, diabetes can be fatal." She urged everyone to take the test and particularly those who have the symptoms of diabetes. They are increasing thirst and hunger, frequent urination, unexplained loss of weight, itching, easy tiring, changes in vision and slow healing of cuts and scratches.

The Diabetes Assn. hopes to screen at least 25,000 persons this year. Last year it was found that one out of 65 persons who received the preliminary screening test through a urine analysis had positive findings, or sugar in the urine.
