Veres Caps All-America Drive By Passing for Four Touchdown

Exploding with a history-making offensive drive, El Camino College wound up the 1960 football season with a 4-3 conference record and an annihilating 62-22 win over the Knights of San Diego in the border town Saturday.

Behind the pin-point passing of Ron Veres, the Warriors amassed a 40-point lead at half-time.

WITH 178 YARDS gained through the air in the first 30 minutes of play, the El Camino passing wizard ran the score to 36-0 before the Warrior reserves came to relieve the point-producing Tribe with four minutes left in the first half.

Taking advantage of Knight miscues, the Tribe reserves tallied four times to round-out the El Camino field day.

Dave Anderson proved to be the leading Warrior runner as he scored three times, including an 86-yard kickoff return.

Jim Hester and Bob Pier took over the receiving end of things as they accounted for 26 points in the point-a-minute brigade.

Paul Bursleson was covered well, but the top-scoring end netted two conversions on passes for four points to reach a total of 64 points for the season, leading conference ends in this department.




