

Chamberlain, Elgin Duel in Arena Tonight

Pro basketball's two most explosive offensive players — Los Angeles' Elgin Baylor and Philadelphia's Wilt Chamberlain — face each other on the firing line at the Los Angeles Sports Arena in an important two-game National Basketball Association series tonight and Monday.

It will be a battle of contrasting styles between the league's two top scorers.

Wilt the Stilt, the NBA's most controversial figure, is a high-scoring 7'1" center who has been described by none other than Baylor himself as "80% of the Warriors attack." Wilt is a deadly "man in motion" with a high field goal average and an unusually agile seven-footer. However, he is woefully weak from the free throw line, where he missed more than 400 last year.

BAYLOR, on the other hand, is not a "giant" in size, only in ability, among NBA offensive stars. The 6'5" forward can hit from the outside, but is noted for his driving "wrist action" shooting from under

In recognition of Wilt's appearance, all 7-footers will be admitted free tonight and Monday nights, according to Laker General Manager Lou Mohs.


the basket. From the foul shot line he is one of the NBA's most lethal shooters with an 80-plus percentage.

Both men are phenomenal defensive players, as well. Chamberlain led the league in the rebounding department as a rookie last season. Baylor is the circuit's current leader at pulling the ball off the backboard.

Chamberlain isn't making the trip to Los Angeles alone. He'll get help from a three-time all-pro, Paul Arizin, as well as Tom Gola and Guy Rodgers, among others.

CHAMBERLAIN is said to be the highest-paid athlete in sports today. His salary for the next three years is pegged at \$300,000.

Chamberlain is the first player in the history of sports to be a major league team's first draft choice while he was an All-City star at Philadelphia's Overbrook High.

LBCC, Tyler Only Unbeaten Teams In Nation to Collide in Bowl Game

Coach Jim Stangeland's Long Beach City College Vikings, the Bowl team in a decade, got down to serious business this week after a huge downtown rally Monday celebrating their choice as western representative in the Dec. 10 Pasadena classic.

After scouting Tyler Junior College, the eastern JRB entry, last weekend, Stangeland is convinced that the Vikings will face their toughest opponent yet in what has already been a formidable schedule. The Tyler Apaches, who closed out a perfect 12-0 season by blasting Kilgore 30-14, have amassed 331 points while allowing only 106.

THE VIKINGS, 9-0 for the first perfect season in school history, have scored 244 points to 111 for their foes. Both schools will be making their second Junior Rose Bowl appearance. The Texans from Tyler lost a 28-26 thriller to Pasadena in 1951, the year after LBCC downed Boise J.C. 33-13.

Junior Rose Bowl officials anticipate a record crowd of 65,000 or more for the only major bowl game in the coun-

try this season which will feature two undefeated, untied entries.

Though they gave Long Beach fans some anxious moments, the Vikings got past the fired-up East L.A. Huskies 20-15 last weekend, after trailing 15-14 late in the fourth quarter. Long Beach nipped El

Bakersfield College, 1959 Junior Rose Bowl champion, has been selected for the Potato Bowl game in Bakersfield on Dec. 3. The Renegades opponent in the annual football classic will be Cerritos J.C.

Camino midway in the season, 12-8.

Quarterback Dave Groff set a new season record for passing yardage by netting 113 yards against East L.A. for a new 9-game total of 945 yards. (This breaks the standard of 940 set by Jack Price of the 1950 Junior Rose Bowl team.) Groff also set a new single game mark of 250 yards early in the season.

ALSO MOVING way, way up in the all-time records were fullback Lonzo Irvin (despite sitting out two mid-season

games), left half Dee Andrews and right half Willie Martin.

Irvin, who scored two TD's and a 2-point conversion, brought his season total to 90 points, second only to the record of 100 set by Benny Aoki in 1951. Irvin is also second in season rushing with 885 net yards.

Andrews, who netted 149 yards against the Huskies (including a 65-yard touchdown), is right behind Irvin with a season total of 860 yards. Martin now ranks second in pass receiving only to Bill Raine of the great '50 team, with a 9-game total of 570 yards on 24 passes, six of them for touchdowns.


"Daly" vs. "Garrison"

"Father" Bill Daly and jockey Edward "Snapper" Garrison lend their names to colloquialisms of Thoroughbred racing that describe two very opposite styles of riding. When it is said that a horse is "on the Bill Daly," he is running in front under strong persuasion. But when a horse comes from behind and gets up to win by

a photogenic nose, he does so in a "Garrison finish."

Snapper Garrison, a top rider in the 1890's and later a prominent racing official at Hialeah, Arlington Park, etc., obviously developed his riding style after his apprenticeship to Father Bill Daly.

William Cronin Daly was a stern tutor, and used a baling stick to emphasize a point. He also carried a pocket full of quarters and, win or lose, the jockey got a shiny 25c piece for every pole at which he had his horse in front. Daly's reasoning was simple: "Son," he'd say, "that's a rough bit of the world, and those are tough old jocks you'll be riding against; get away in front and stay there as long as you can."
