City Chest Drive at 65 Per Cent Of Goal, Greater Efforts Urged

Torrance's Community Chest campaign now stands 65 per cent of its \$32,046 goal, but greater efforts are required, according to Harold Frenz, Torrance City Chest chairman.

"Greater efforts by our leaders," said Frenz, "must be made during the final weeks of this campaign. Our various unit, division and section chairmen must encourage those volunteers who are not producing. We will not reach our goal unless we have asked everyone in Torrance to give."

The United appeal in Torrance is broken down into four main divisions, commerce and industry, advance gifts, business, and residential.

The Torrance commerce and industry campaign, directed by Ralph Morris, has now achieved 53 per cent of its quota. Torrance advance gifts chairman, Dr. Robert Jackson, reports 75 per cent of his quota has been collected. John Schwartz, Torrance business chairman, reports 47 per cent of his quota.

The residential campaign, under the leadership of Mrs. R. W. Klock (South Torrance), Mrs. Aurora Derouin (Central Torrance), and Mrs. Edward D. Schneider (North Torrance), now stands at 86 per cent of its quota.

DIVISION chairmen who are assisting Mrs. Klock are Mrs. Glenn Singer, Mrs. Janet Weiant, Mrs. B. J. Brown, and Mrs. J. B. Mosley.

Torrance division chairmen, working under Mrs. Derouin, are Mrs. J. A. Davis, Mrs. Bert Lynn, and Mrs. Gladys Seefried.

Division chairmen, under the direction of Mrs. Schneider, are Mrs. Gladys Holt, Mrs. Josephine Colclasure, Mrs. Robert West, Mrs. Alice Uyeda, and Mrs. Dorothy Chadwick.

Chest officials are urging Torrance volunteers to try to complete their assignments before the Dec. 8 report meeting. At that time Torrance and all other Los Angeles area cities will report funds collected to date.

Astropower, Inc., Forms Board, Elects Douglas Jr.

Organization of its board of directors was announced today by Astropower, Inc., a corporation formed recently to conduct research and development in advanced propulsion systems and power equipment.

Chairman of the seven-member board is Donald W. Douglas Jr., president of the Douglas Aircraft Co. Y. C. Lee, propulsion expert and president of Astropower, is a member of the board as are Dr. George Moe, Astropower vice president-re-

search, and Edward W. Smith, Astropower vice president-administration. Other board members include three Douglas Aircraft Co. executives, John A. Dundas, Charles R. Able, and Elmer P. Wheaton.

LEE SAID that although Astropower is a subsidiary, its operation will be completely separated from the Douglas Aircraft Co. The new company will offer its services in research and development to all major system contractors and government agencies involved in space projects. Astropower will respect and protect the proprietary interests of major system contractors.

He also announced that Astropower will initiate a balanced engineering and research program to promote the growth of the new company. Astropower projects will include research and development of ultra-high energy propulsion systems in the chemical and nuclear fields in addition to solid-state devices and energy conversion systems.

A STAFF of qualified engineering and scientific personnel is now being assembled at 3801 Lakewood Blvd., Long Beach. Sites for permanent facilities for Astropower are being surveyed in the general Newport Beach area.

Lee announced the election of Charles Clay Noah as a vice president and secretary-treasurer of Astropower. Noah was manager of deployment in the Douglas Deployment Division prior to his election to the new post.
