Young men and women thinking of joining the Army were told this week that December is the best time by SFC Elgin Elliott and S/Sgt. Donald Fleming, local U. S. Army Recruiting team.

All men who join the Army in December may be sworn in as a group on Dec. 19, 1960, and, if desired by the applicant, will remain home until Jan. 2, 1961. This will allow all applicants to be home over the Christmas and New Year's holidays, Sgt. Elliott said.

The three year enlistment period will start the day the applicant is sworn in, even though he will not leave for Fort Ord to begin basic training until Jan. 2, 1961.

"The best part of the program to keep in mind is not only will they be home for Christmas this year, but they will be discharged and return-

ing home at the end of their enlistment just before the holidays three years from now," Sgt. Elliott said.

Contract Let For Widening Of Sepulveda

Widening of one-half mile of Sepulveda Blvd., between Figueroa and Main Sts. near reality Tuesday with the awarding of the contract to the Tomei Construction Co. for the amount of \$190,842.41.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace, who represents the area, said the improvement of the road will become an important access to the Harbor Freeway which is now being extended across Sepulveda at a point between Vermont Ave. and Figueroa St.

Pointing out that work on the project will begin immediately, Chace explained that plans call for reconstruction to alleviate critical structural deficiencies and widening of the boulevard to handle four lanes.

The one-half mile portion of Sepulveda now handles approximately 14,000 vehicles daily and this number will be increased considerably upon completion of the Harbor Freeway.

Chace said further improvements are planned for Sepulveda, with the County Road Department now in the final stages of planning for widening Sepulveda between Vermont and Normandie Aves.
