YMCA 'Solons' To Have Bills Judged Tonight

Potential young politicians of the Torrance YMCA will get their "acid test" tonight in the City Hall as they present bills they have written for February's Model Legislature to a panel of adult judges.

Each high school student will have two minutes to present his or her bill and try to convince the judges that it is one the local delegation should submit to the citizenship training even in Sacramento.

In addition, the local delegation, to consist of a Senator, Assemblyman and two Delegates-in-Training, will be selected on the basis of how the boys and girls present their arguments.

In the interim they have studied and talked to experts before writing their bill. Following tonight's selection, the group will marshal arguments, prepare lobbying materials and in other ways get ready to present their bill to the other high school Delegates in Sacramento.



Looking ahead, the Torrance Board of Education Tuesday night adopted a 177-day school calendar for the 1961-62 school year.

Under the adopted calendar, school would start on Wednesday, Sept. 13, 1961, and let out on Friday, June 15, 1962. A two-day teacher institute would precede the opening of school.

The usual holidays will be observed, with Christmas holidays from Dec. 18, 1961 through Jan. 1, 1962 and Easter holidays from April 16-20, 1962.
