The El Camino College wrestlers will try to snap a four-meet losing string over a two-year period when they entertain Mount San Antonio College Saturday at 7:30 p.m. in the Women's Gym.

El Camino bowed 20-15 to defending champions from San Bernardino last week in a Southern California JC Conference meet.

TRAILING by scores of 12-2 and 17-7 in the top meet of the week in junior college wrestling circles, El Camino narrowed the lead to 17-15 before bowing.

In the crucial event, Sam Maus of the Warriors was manhandled by Harold Beach 20-9, and the men of San Bernardino were the winners of the meet.

OUTSTANDING performances by El Camino's Paul Cook and Co-captains Frank Dolce and Alex Munson prevented San Bernardino from turning the meet into a rout.

Dolce pinned Ken Knuss in 53 seconds.

# Long Beach Slightly Favored Over Tyler in Saturday's Jr. Rose Bowl

"We're looking for the toughest game we've played," maintained the Long Beach City College's football coach, Jim Stangeland.

The Vikings will battle Tyler, Texas, Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in the Junior Rose Bowl in Pasadena. While the Vikes went undefeated in nine contests, the Apaches swept past 12 foes.

Observers are predicting a

battle of Tyler power against Long Beach explosiveness. Of the 3588 yards gained by Tyler, only 791 was through the air. Meanwhile, 1227 of Long Beach's 3455 total yards came through the air lanes.

Top rusher for Tyler was Henry Boxley, who gained 667 yards with 137 carries for a 4.9 average. Outside of L.B.C.C. slotback Willie Martin (119 yards in 14 carries

for an 8.4 average), two Viking ball carriers have better rushing averages. Fullback Lonzo Irvin (who missed two games) gained 885 yards in 135 carries for a 6.5 average. Halfback Dee Andrews picked up 860 yards in 134 carries for a 6.4 average. Irvin led Long Beach scorers with 14 touchdowns and three conversions as compared to quarterback Jimmy Lyons of the Apaches who scored 12

touchdowns and two points after to pace his team.

LBCC averaged 236 yards per game on the ground and 136 in the air for a 372-yard figure. The Apaches gained 233 yards rushing and 66 passing per contest for a 299-total yards gained per game average.

Tyler's 12 foes were held to a 147-yard total per game average, while Long Beach allowed 256 yards per game

to its opponents.  
Two LBCC's regular defensive starters, end Dave Dorran and halfback Chris Dawson, will not be able to start because of injuries.  
Offensively, the Vikings will go-go-go (they hope) with the same unit they've used all year, including pint-size co-captain Wayne Zimmerman at the center spot.
