


# North Shows Power in Tournament

## Saxons, South Beat Torrance; Hills Classic Next

North and Torrance high school cagers, just off the griddle of the Pacific Shores Tournament, jump feet first into another of the Southland's top prep basketball classics Tuesday with the 19th renewal of the annual Beverly Hills Invitational. The tourney gets underway at 3 p.m. Tuesday when favored Culver City squares off against Bellflower in the famed Swim Gym. North, which went up against Mira Costa for third place in the Shores tourney

in Redondo last night, gets into action Tuesday against Anaheim at 6 p.m. Torrance's first test will be on Wednesday, against Santa Monica at 7:30 p.m. South is not entered. Sixteen of the Southland's top cage teams will fight it out for the elusive and much sought after champion's crown in the tourney which has developed into one of the outstanding athletic events in Southern California.

A Torrance school has never won the Beverly championship. North is the city's big hope this year. The Saxons suffered their first defeat of the young season in the semi-finals of the Pacific Shores by Glendale, Friday, 75-64. Bill Wood's sharpshooters, who hit on 43 per cent of their floor shots for the night, had previous tourney wins over rival Torrance (76-64) and tough Culver City in a thriller on a last

second field goal by Sparky Davidson. Against Glendale, which tied for a second successive tourney title last night, center Bob Mance came into his own in the first half in what was one of the finest 16 minute performances in recent history by a local cager. The springy-legged blond hustler totaled 19 points on seven field goals and five free throws to almost single-handedly keep his mates within shooting distance of the Dynamiters.

Mance, a senior, zeroed in on the first 13 shots he took and showed a complete repertoire of offensive moves. However, he didn't score a field goal in the second half and finished the game with 20 points. For the first time in Torrance's history, the Tartars were defeated by both intracity rivals in the same sport in one week. After North broke its school scoring record against Will Boerger's club in the tourney opener Wednesday, South came back

and eliminated the Tartars Thursday, 61-57. South went all the way to the consolation semi-finals against Hawthorne last night after edging Loyola in a chiller Friday, 57 to 56 as Joe Austin swished a couple of free throws with 17 seconds remaining to win it. **Harbor Basketball** Harbor College will play in the Chaffey Basketball Tournament to be held at Chaffey on Dec. 26, 27, 28, and 29.
