North's intra-city cousin, Torrance, went up against Santa Monica's Vikings in the tourney last night. Results were not available at press time.

South, not entered in the southland prep cage classic, tested Cathedral High Tuesday and came away a surprisingly easy 60-41 victor, although ace scorer Joe Austin did not play for the second straight game.

Senior center Mike Andrews, who piped in 18 points and dominated the rebounding statistics for South, led the locals' attack as the up and coming Spartans notched their fourth straight win after three opening game setbacks.

South took three in a row in the Pacific Shores Tournament last weekend to win the consolation championship. North

was third in the championship flight.

Andrews, and Saxons Rick Jacobs and Bob Mance were named to the all-tournament team.

Tuesday, four Saxons were in the double figure bracket, topped by center Sparky Davidson's 11 points, as North scored the narrow win. The Saxons had a five point, 49-44 lead with time running out, but Anaheim zeroed in on a couple of field goals to cut the gap to just one point, only to blow the show with 0:03 to go.

Anaheim held the ball in a stall that lasted 1:20 in an effort to get off a last field goal attempt. However, it missed. But North's Davidson was charged with a foul in a resulting tie-up, and Anaheim missed the gift toss.

In South's convincing 60-41 triumph, Andrews connected on six field goals and six free throws for his game high total. He had eight points in the second quarter to spark a get-away move by the winners.


