

International Fair Planned in Southland; May Be Nearby

The greatest international exposition ever planned will be held in Los Angeles County in 1966, it was revealed yesterday by E. O. Rodeffer, chairman of the board of directors for the International Exposition for Southern California, Inc. The fair may be held in the East Torrance, Dominguez area, private sources said.

Rodeffer filed a resolution "intention to construct the 10 million Exposition with county Recorder Ray E. Lee. is expected to have more lions enter exhibits and will viewed by more people than other fair in history. organized last July, the Ex-position corporation completed six-month study of the feasibility of staging a world's fair before filing the resolution of intention. The study privately financed, with any subsidy from tax

in this county is entirely feasible, Rodeffer said in filing the resolution. "The studies also show that it should be located within the center of the population area. This means the eventual site will be within a radius of 8 miles from the downtown Civic Center area.

"There are several suitable sites available, and the corporation's site selection committee is evaluating final reports before selecting the definite site," he added.

NAMED AS Vice-Chairman of the Exposition Committee was Arch Field, president of the Los Angeles Board of Public Works. Also called into service was H. O. Davis, retired editor and director of both the 1915 and 1935 San Diego World Fairs. He also created, built and directed the Olympic Village during the 1932 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. He is chairman of the Corporation's Advisory Committee.

Rodeffer said the exposition group also hopes to contract a monorail system in cooperation with the Metropolitan Transit Authority, which will provide round-trip transportation from downtown Los Angeles to the exposition with a total elapsed time of about 10 minutes.

HE SAID the site for the exposition will encompass 500 acres, of which 200 acres will be devoted to parking facilities.

Theme for the exposition will be "The Planet of Man." The resolution stated this theme will be separated into five realms: The realms of living, learning, working, moving, and playing.

"This theme will show," Rodeffer said, "the five major phases of man's life on earth. It will enable many countries who otherwise might not participate, to exhibit their talents and culture, rather than industrial products. It will be a major factor in the promotion of international understanding and goodwill."
