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Handel's 'The Messiah' to Be Given at St. Francis on Sunday

With each passing year the quality of the presentation of 'The Messiah' at St. Francis Church has increased until the performance has attained the position of being one of the most significant choral events in this area.

During the current orchestral season, Miss Gibson will be heard nine times as soloist. She sang recently in Palos Verdes Estates at the meeting of the Peninsula Committee for the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra.
