



Gunmen Rob 2 Stores of Cash Exceeding \$1000

Two Torrance firms were victims of armed robbers this week, with bandits escaping with more than \$1000 in one of the holdups.

Cashier Ernest Feissel at the credit desk of Certibond, 501 Arlington Ave., looked up to see two gunmen holding pistols and asking for the money late Friday.

The bandits shoved packages of one-dollar bills into a paper sack before walking out of the store, and fleeing in an auto driven by a third man. A total between \$1000 and \$1100 was taken, police were told.

A lone gunman walked into the Food King Market at Arlington and Carson St. Thursday afternoon and took \$267 from the checker Edward Ward. The gunman took the money from the register, walked out the back door of the store and fled up the alley on foot. Ward chased the bandit, but lost him in an alley.

Walteria Library is Busiest In the County, Survey Shows

Residents of the Fourth Supervisorial District, represented by Supervisor Burton W. Chace, read 1,312,046 books during the past fiscal year ending on June 30.

These books were drawn out by 117,707 borrowers from 18 branch libraries and one mobile library, Chace disclosed. The mobile library is used for the Malibu Coastal area.

Although no record is kept of books in reading rooms, Chace said that each of the 18 libraries are always crowded to capacity during evenings of the school year.

Preliminary plans and architectural design for a new building for the Manhattan Heights branch are now being developed by the County Engineer. Sepulveda branch in Culver City will be relocated early next year and converted to an all-children's branch. El Marino, Culver City's third branch, became a children's library a year ago.

PLANS FOR a new building in Hermosa Beach of 6000 square feet, are now well under way. This is almost twice as large as quarters now being used, Chace said.

The Lomita branch was relocated last February in a leased building which is three times as large as the former premises. Carson branch is now located in a 5000 square-foot building, being relocated from a small 800 square-foot building in March, 1959. Villa Carson, a small building, became a children's library three years ago.

Supervisor Chace said it is the policy of the County Library to convert small branches into children's libraries whenever larger buildings are available for adult books and reference material.

Other steps taken by the County to provide additional library service were outlined by Chace.

A NEW WING was added to the Compton library in November, 1959. An addition of 1500 square feet is now being considered for the East Compton branch.

Avalon will get a new and larger building as soon as the Santa Catalina Island Company completes the proposed Avalon Civic Center.

El Retiro branch will be increased from 2500 square feet to 4500.

Walteria will probably be increased from 810 to 5000 square feet.

Dealer Helps Family Get Washer Fixed
