Hospital Administrator Addresses Optimist Club

Guest speaker of the Dec. 13 meeting of the Torrance Optimist Club held at the Palms Restaurant was Leonard Ensinger, administrator for the Torrance Memorial Hospital, who was introduced by Dr. Bill Johnson.

Ensinger told the Optimists that Sidney Jared Torrance started the hospital as a community project in 1921, and has left all the income from the Brack Shops in Los Angeles to the hospital as a con-

tinual income. All of the staff members are approved by a board of directors made up primarily of non-medical professional men in Torrance. There are three employees for every patient in the hospital which is much higher than the national average and gives the patient a much better service.

Ensinger also stated that the hospital has the best modern equipment available and have just completed a pediatric wing and have plans for
