Mark Wood to Head South Bay Hospital Board

Elected president of South Bay Hospital District Board of Directors Wednesday night was Mark Wood, South Bay attorney and member of the hospital Board since its creation five years ago.

He succeeds Auten F. Bush who will finish his second year as president Dec. 31.

Elected secretary-treasurer of the Board was Lester L. Carlson, succeeding Herman R. Brandt who will end a 4-year stint as secretary-treasurer Dec. 31. Hospital directors apparently have reverted to their original plan of yearly rotation of officer jobs now that the hospital is on a normal operational basis.

WOOD WAS unanimously voted to the chair by fellow Board members.

"South Bay Hospital has proved itself a worthy and needed medical facility in the greater South Bay community since its opening in August.

"The Board, hospital employees and professional staff are striving to make it an outstanding major medical institution for residents and taxpayers of South Bay who have voted for it and purchased it," Wood said.

THE NEW Board president has practiced law in South Bay for approximately 10 years following his graduation from Loyola University Law School in 1949. He has been prosecutor for the City of Manhattan Beach for approximately five years, and has his law offices in south Redondo Beach.

Prior to law school, Wood served as a naval aviator in World War II and saw duty in the Pacific theater. He presently holds the rank of commander in the naval reserve.

WOOD HAS been past president of the Loyola University Alumni Association, South Bay District Bar Association, and American Martyrs Church Men's Club. In addition to activity in these groups, he belongs to Los Angeles and California bar associations, Redondo Beach Elks and Knights of Columbus.

He lives at 828 Highview Ave., Manhattan Beach, with his wife, Ebba, and three children, Mark Jr., 18; Scott, 16, and Brita Ann, 13.

CARLSON, new secretary-treasurer of the board, is district manager of California Water Service Co. He was appointed last year to the unexpired term of the late Clyde Marsh, and as such is the newest member of the 5-man governing agency of the 150-bed South Bay Hospital.

Carlson was born and raised in Chico and studied at the L. L. Cook school of electrical engineering, Chicago. He retired from 18 years service in the National Guard with the rank of captain, and now holds membership in Masons, Eastern Star, White Shrine and Redondo Beach Rotary.

He lives at 322 Ruby St., Redondo, with his wife, Ellen. He has three children, Robert, Roberta and Mrs. Nan Nell Haney, and three grandchildren.

Schools Find 1324 Having Speech Woes

Some 1324 Torrance schools youngsters were found to have speech problems of various kinds this year, according to officials.

Some 3725 students, including all second graders and other students referred by teachers, were checked. Of the 1325 with problems, 844 will receive school help. Of the rest, some were considered only minor problems, while others were suggested for referral to a doctor.

Types of problems included articulation problems (substituting sounds, distortions, etc.), 1213; stutters, 48; hard of hearing, 25; cleft palate, 8; voice problems, 16; and other, 14.

Articulation problems, accounting for 94 per cent, include such things as pronouncing "rabbit" as "wabbit," "little" as "tittle," etc.
