Improvements include construction of pavement, curb and gutter, drainage structures and sidewalks to serve 119 new homes in the area. They were constructed under the supervision of the County Road Department by the developer at a cost of approximately \$384,100 and will add 1.2 miles to the County system of maintained highways, Chace said.

### County Votes Cash Aid for Crenshaw Job

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced this week that the Board of Supervisors has appropriated \$7880 in aid to cities gas funds to the City of Torrance to be used in the improvement of Crenshaw Blvd. between 176th and 177th Sts.

The allocation was made on the basis that the street work to be done would be of general benefit to the motoring public.

Improvements will consist of construction of curbs and gutters and extension of pavement to the new curb line. Supervisor Hahn pointed out that this section of Crenshaw is heavily traveled, and that completion of the project will expedite the movement of traffic in this area.

Under terms of the allocation, the City of Torrance must start work within 60 days of receipt of the money.


