


Jammed Gym Sees North Lose

Marge Fox of Torrance in All Star Tourney

San Bernardino, Calif.—Mrs. Marge Fox of Torrance, is ready to roll in the 20th annual BPA All-Star Bowling Tournament to be held here Jan. 12-21 inclusive.

She is one of only 96 women who have qualified from an original national field of several thousand men and women. The 336 qualifiers, including 240 men, represent a record number of 42 states, including Hawaii and Alaska.

This marks the initial All-Star appearance for Mrs. Fox, who was a member of the 1960 Los Angeles city women champions. Her highest 1959-60 league average was 187, with a high game of 278 and a high series of 726.

The field of 240 men and 96 women from 42 states including Alaska and Hawaii are survivors of an original record field of nearly 12,000 who attempted to qualify for 304 spots, 32 bowlers having been seeded through Bowling Proprietors' Association of America tournaments.

The BPA has increased prize money to a record \$68,150, an increase of \$8,150 over last year. Top money remains at \$10,000 in the men's division and \$5,000 in women's.

The final hour for the gruelling 10-day test will be aired over the full American Broadcasting Company television network, Saturday night, Jan. 21.


