Officials Plan Session To Study Beach Property

Residents who have homes along the city's beach front were told Tuesday evening that a meeting between county officials and property owners in the area had been arranged early next month in an effort to find a way to develop the property.

Councilman J. A. Beasley reported that a meeting between a representative of Supervisor Burton W. Chace and owners of property along the beach front had been arranged for Feb. 2 at which time the possible acquisition of the property by the county would be discussed.

Beasley's announcement, which was a surprise even to City Manager George Stevens, was made after a petition signed by residents of the area asked the council for help in abating the nuisance of the undeveloped beach along Paseo de la Playa.

"I can't discuss the meeting publicly," Beasley said, indicating that the session was not open to the public.

The council agreed that John F. Scanlon of 316 Paseo de la Playa would be notified of any developments. Scanlon, who spoke before the council on the matter, has been spearheading a drive to get the beach front converted to public property.




