John Kucharik, who operates the Kucharik Bicycle and Sports Shop at 5023 Pacific Coast Hwy., at Calle Mayor, revealed plans to organize a club to promote efficiency and skill in bicycle riding among area enthusiasts.

Kucharik placed fifth in

Olympic tryouts in Philadelphia in 1940, missing the U.S. Olympic team of four riders by one place.

He has already had inquiries from persons ranging in age from 12 on up, he reports. Persons joining the club will be taught how to ride properly, rules of safety, proper equipment, and elements of competitive riding. Trophies will be offered in various categories throughout the year, and some may qualify to ride in regional competitions, Kucharik said.
