Pleasure Boating Big Business Marine Assn. Figures Indicate

Pleasure boating, fastest growing family recreation in the country, has become big business, according to 1960 figures released by the Southern California Marine Assn.

Americans spent more than \$2.5 billion on new and used boats, motors and accessories in 1960, SCMA reported. This represents a \$50 million increase over 1959.

SCMA is sponsoring the annual Southern California Boat Show now through Sunday, Jan. 29th, at Great Western Exhibit Center, just off the Santa Ana Freeway at Atlantic Blvd., to showcase the 1961 models of pleasure craft from all over the U.S.

The 200,000 square feet of exhibit booths at the marine exposition indicate that the growing number of women who have become a major part of the family boating scene have influenced interior design of the '61 boats to an important degree. More headroom, more galley space and more comfortable appointments are noted in the pleasure craft on display.

H. WERNER BUCK, executive producer of the show, reported that the number of exhibitors allocated space had broken all past records.

Southern California has become the second greatest market for pleasure boats, engines

by SCMA show that the U.S. pleasure fleet consumed 547,000,000 gallons of gasoline, 25,200,000 gallons of lubricating oil, and 30,000,000 gallons of diesel fuel in 1960.

The giant Southern California Boat Show officially starts the boating year in Southern California. The SCMA-sponsored exhibit is the largest display of marine equipment, boats and trailers west of the Atlantic seaboard.
