

SAXONS STAY TWO GAMES OFF PACE IN PIONEER LOOP PLAY

Micohi Edges Saxons

Inglewood, the undefeated leader of the Bay League, jumped to a two-game margin over second place North Torrance by scoring an unimpressive 41 to 30 victory over seventh place Hawthorne Friday night.

Inglewood's high scoring Roger Garrick was held to only 10 points while teammate Burlenson swished 14. The same held true for Hawthorne's high man Mykkanen also with 10 points while teammate Petch ran up a 14 total.

NORTH Torrance, who was only one game off leading Inglewood going into Friday's game, suffered 72 to 69 at the hands of an inspired Mira Costa team. Mira Costa, boosted by the 22 points of Gonneman breezed through the first three quarters but their apocryph was almost overturned during the fourth when North rang up 20 points to Mira Costa's 16. High men for North were Davidson with 24 digits and Golphnee with 15.

South, who lost to North in their Wednesday encounter, came back to snatch a thriller from Morningside Friday which puts them only one game behind second place North in Bay League standings.

MORNINGSIDE'S high scoring Kauth found the groove and did 22 points worth of damage to South's defenses. With never more than a four point quarterly difference, South put their trust in high scoring Andrews, Austin, and Mannix, who tallied 18, 14, and 16 points respectively defeating Morningside 64 to 63.

Redondo retained her grip on the cellar by losing to Leuzinger. High point men for Redondo were Willis with 15 and Graves with 12.

LEADING the pack for Leuzinger were Newton and Manual with 12 points each. Leuzinger led from the start and finished with a 65 to 43 victory.

In Wednesday's games, North kept pace with undefeated Inglewood by outscoring South 85-76 in the loser's gym.

Referred to as the "Civil War", North surprised South's go-go style of play with a pressing attack of their own.

BOB MANCE led the scoring parade with 22 points-high man for the game - to steal the scoring spotlight from South's Joe Austin who garnered 19 digits.

Inglewood, paced by Roger Garrick's 32 points, took a strong grip on the Bay League Championship with a 75-66

basketball win over rival Morningside.

Garrick, the high powered Sentinel guard, boosted his average over the 20 point mark with his fine effort against an inspired Morningside five.

MIRA COSTA ripped through Redondo for an 85-43 victory. Jim Stroot, the lone Seahawk offensive threat, missed another game due to an ankle injury and rumors are that he is out for the season.

Mira Costa starters only played half the game with the reserves finishing up. Jim MacDonald led all Mira Costa scorers with 24 points while another scoring sub, Mitch Malpee, sunk 14.
