# Torrance Area Women to Note 75th 'World Day of Prayer'

Tomorrow marks the 75th anniversary of the World Day of Prayer. The Torrance-Lomita Council of United Church Women will hold their services at the WALTERIA COMMUNITY Methodist Church, 3346 Newton St., at 1 p.m. The speaker is to be the Rev. David O. Beadles, of the WALTERIA Methodist Church.

World Day of Prayer, sponsored in the U. S. by United Church Women of the National Council of Churches, began in 1887 at the suggestion of one woman of one denomination to pray for the success of its home missions and to bring gifts for their support. It has grown into a giant interdenominational, international prayer cycle, with the people of 145 countries and in America, 22,000 communities holding special services.

MRS. BERT Pemble, president of the Torrance-Lomita Council of United Church Women, announces the anniversary service will be based on

the theme, "Forward Through the Ages."

One of the World Day of Prayer goals is an offering of \$750,000 for the regular on-going extensive educational, medical, and religious projects around the world, and two anniversary specials.

ONE SPECIAL project is a massive literature program for the new Africa, with a Christian training center for African writers, the production of half-a-million books written by Africans for Africans, and the first stage of a coordinated program of training writers in the special techniques of radio script writing.

The other "75th" special is a creative mission in Alaska, our newest state. Here specialists in church planning and social welfare will assist Alaska's growing churches to develop a sense of community and a basic correlated strategy of Christian ministry and witness.

All women of this area are invited to attend the local observance to be a part of this great world-wide program.
