One-Car Crash Takes High Toll, CHP Announces

More than half of the fatal accidents investigated by California Highway Patrol officers during 1960 involved a single vehicle, Commissioner Bradford Crittenden said this week.

"Of 1977 fatal accidents in Patrol areas, 1111 were in the one-car category. The implication is obvious. Your safety as a driver rests squarely in your own hands. In a majority of last year's fatal accidents, the driver of the involved car had only himself to blame.

"The Patrol often has emphasized defensive driving as a protection against the unexpected actions of other drivers, but it is equally important to recognize the causes which contribute to accidents of individual cars," the commissioner said.

"Excessive speed, misjudgment of roadway conditions, defective equipment, deliberate violation of safety rules — these are among factors which can send your car into a fatal skid, into a bridge abutment, or into a rollover.

"The sensible application of safe driving practices is the surest defense against motor vehicle accidents of any type," Commissioner Crittenden concluded.


