Bishop Curtis Confirms Class Of 50 at St. Andrew's Tuesday

One of the largest classes ever confirmed at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church received the sacrament of the laying on of hands from Suffragan Bishop Ivor C. Curtis Tuesday evening before a capacity congregation at the church, 1432 Encarnacion Ave.

The Rev. Hugh R. Percy, rector of St. Andrew's, presented a class of more than 50 candidates to Bishop Curtis, who was making his first visit to the St. Andrew's parish since his elevation to the high Diocese office last year.

Included in the class, which has been taking instructions each Sunday afternoon since last fall, were children and adults, including several members of some families.

THE FIRST communion for the newly confirmed members will be held at the 7:30 a.m. service Sunday with Father Percy as the celebrant. Also participating as a corporate group will be members of St. Cecilia's Guild.

Other services at the church this weekend include the weekly study-prayer group which will meet today at 10:15 a.m. followed by Holy Communion at 11.

ST. MATTHIAS Day will be observed tomorrow with the celebration of Holy Eucharist at 6:30 a.m. The Acolytes will have their Corporate Communion at this service.

A fellowship breakfast will be offered to the newly confirmed class at the church following the service.

Young People To Conduct Rites Sunday

Youth Sunday will be observed at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection next Sunday, it was announced here yesterday by Pastor Marvin Rygh. Young people of the church will conduct services at all three meetings at the church, 330 Palos Verdes Blvd.

The entire service will be under the direction of the young people of the congregation, the pastor said. Some members have been selected to do the speaking, others have formed a special choir, and several of the young men will do the ushering.

MONDAY evening, a special banquet will be served to approximately 60 Sunday School teachers and their husbands or wives.

The Mothers' Club, under the leadership of Mrs. Robert Frost, is preparing and will serve a dinner of beef Stroganoff, wild rice, green beans, and slivered almonds. Hot rolls, coffee, ice cream, and a cake will round out the menu.

FEATURED speaker for the banquet will be Pastor Petrusen of the California Lutheran Bible School.

A special program scheduled for Tuesday will feature the Walter Maier Choral group. The choir represents the Walter Maier Lutheran High School, largest school of its kind in Los Angeles. A speaker from the school will describe its operations and activities.

THE FIRST of the Lenten devotional films, was shown at the church last evening, and the second, "A Faithful Witness," will be shown next Wednesday at 7 p.m. The films are a further development of themes presented in the "Living Christ" series last year.
