Councilman Proposes Geodesic Auditorium for Civic Center

Councilman Willys G. Blount, who called an architect's proposal for a \$7 million auditorium center a "monstrosity," has come up with a counter-proposal which he says can be built for about \$1 million.

A pavilion-type structure, capable of seating 2000 persons for stage productions or as many as 1000 at banquets, would be circular, and as projected, covered with a geodesic dome of anodized aluminum.

THE BANQUET facilities, which could be built into the auditorium as an integral part of the construction, would provide theater-type seating for a thousand persons, officials of Pavilion Development Co., designers of the structure, said this week.

A sub-basement with ramps leading into it from the exterior could be used to store any amount of equipment, and could be used as a staging area for automobiles which could be raised on the elevator stage for dramatic showings, the official pointed out.

SURROUNDING the back walls of the circular auditorium would be offices and exhibit areas, making such a design ideal for art shows, trade shows, and other related activities.

The plan is under consideration by members of the council.

PROTEIN FOODS

BEEF. Look for good buys, especially in the thrifty favorites. Supplies are expected to be about 8 per cent higher than a year ago. Most of the increase will be of the stew, ground beef, and the pot roast type.

LAMB. Plentiful and makes a pleasant change in the menu. Fine quality lambs still coming in from California producers.

PORK. The accent is on fresh pork cuts, particularly loins. Some fine roasts are available. Remember, pork must always be cooked well-done.

POULTRY. Don't overlook turkey. If you are feeding a crowd then turkey is the answer. If you need only a few servings you'll be wise to select cut turkey parts . . . halves, quarters, wings, etc. There are always plenty of chickens . . . fryers, roasters, and stewers.

DAIRY PRODUCTS. Good sources of protein. Cottage cheese, so popular in California, uses most of the protein of about 3 quarts of defatted milk to each pound.

FRUIT

APPLES. Something new has been added, McIntosh . . . and a very few Jonathans . . . coming in from Michigan. Right at the height of the ear-muff season back there they are shipping fine quality fruit to our markets. These apples have been held in what is known as controlled atmosphere storage. This method is costly, so only most carefully selected apples are held. Now after about 90 days of this "conditioning" these apples are available to us. They are crisp and tart. They have a really fresh flavor. There aren't many; they'll move fast. In case you miss these apples you'll find other quality apples for cooking and eating.

AVOCADOS. Most families love Fuertes . . . and they are here.

CITRUS FRUIT. Grapefruit, Oranges, Lemons, Tangerines aplenty. A winter treat. Try those beautiful, large navel oranges peeled, sectioned, and eaten out of hand.

PEARS. Mostly Anjous, but there are some Winter Nelis. PINEAPPLE

Authority on Bach to Give Harpsichord Recital Here

Madame Alice Ehlers, an authority on the music of Bach and on the performance of Baroque music, will present a harpsichord recital March 10, at 8:30 p.m. in the El Camino College Campus Theater.

The program will include an informal lecture on the instrument and its repertoire and a recital in which Madame Ehlers will play music by Bach, Handel and the Baroque French Composers.

Madame Ehlers, a native of Vienna, studied in Berlin under Albert Schweitzer and

Wanda Landowska. After years of study on the harpsichord, she was awarded an honorary doctorate degree from Lewis and Clark College, Wash. Now retired, Madame Ehlers was a professor of music at the University of Southern California.

The Associated Students of El Camino College will sponsor the program, open to the general public for an admission of \$1. All seats for the concert are reserved. Tickets will go on sale Feb. 27 in the campus book store.

Scouts Become Salesmen for Huge Sports, Vacation Show

Bowling pointers will be available in two regulation alleys down the middle of the Sports Arena.

BUT THERE will also be a huge outside area where Los Angeles Area Council Scouts will set up camps and demonstrate their scouting skills.

Explorers, for instance, will present their various Post specialties from judo to skin diving, photography to auto mechanics.

Boy Scouts will demonstrate literally dozens of ways to do outdoor cooking . . . and the

public will get the chance to flip pancakes and participate in other activities.

CUB SCOUTS will give tips on kite making, and will teach and demonstrate games for the family which are fun to play on trips or in the back yard. Members of Order of the Arrow, national camping honor society, will demonstrate Indian lore, and will "live" in a teepee village outside the Coliseum. They will perform authentic Indian dances, and between "shows" will work on their hand-made costumes.

The Scouts goal is to sell

100,000 tickets to the Sports, Vacation and Travel Show. In addition to retaining the entire purchase price of each ticket sold by a Scout, Scouting will receive a percentage of the overall profit of the sports exposition.
