

Riviera Scout Continues Family Tradition by Earning Eagle Rank

The Eagle tradition of his cousin and brother will continue with Gary Emmett Johnson at Torrance Troop 154's first Eagle Court of Honor Tuesday night when the Court will be held at Sea Aire Park Recreation Center.

Gary, 13, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Johnson and brother of Eagle Scout Sandor A. Johnson, who is a member of Redondo Beach Post 288X, lives at 1718 Camino de la Costa. His cousin Paul Greenwald, now at the University of Colorado, became an Eagle in 1951 in Glenn Ellyn, Ill., setting the family pattern.

On Jan. 16, Gary was the Boy Scout Speaker at a BSA sustaining fund breakfast held in the Rodger Young Auditorium in Los Angeles. He has frequently taken part in the programs for Ryan Torrance Management Club banquets.

GARY IS Senior Patrol Leader and Chaplain of the Ryan Management Club sponsored troop and was a charter member and helped the then Scoutmaster Carl Moyer with

its organization in June, 1959, when they both transferred from Redondo Beach Troop 861. Gary was patrol leader for 1½ years for the Eagle Patrol. Scoutmaster Albert Brett now heads Troop 154; Mac McElyea is Institutional Representative; Robert J. Horton (an Eagle Scout) is chairman, and Karl Rink is Advancement chairman.

TRAINED FOR troop leadership at the free week-long Cedar Badge Training Camp at Lake Arrowhead last August. Gary is also a member of Wyandot Chapter, Kiwanis Lodge #252, Order of Arrow, Boy Scout Honor Fraternity. His Ner Tamid (Jewish religious award) is nearing completion and on Dec. 22, 1959 at Gary's Life Court of Honor, Rabbi Henri Front (an Eagle Scout) of Temple Menorah presented him with his Aleph Award Certificate and gold Menorah pin indicating the completion of initial requirements.

AS A WEBELO. Gary graduated from Cub Scout Pack 3 of Burbank (in which he has been active since his eighth birthday) into Burbank Troop 1, headed by Scoutmaster Sandy Howard. His Tenderfoot Court of Honor was May 27, 1958. Second and First Class were both presented on Sept. 9, 1958. Troop 861 of Redondo Beach held Gary's Star Court of Honor at the First Baptist Church in March, 1959.

Ralph L. Lightwine, South Bay District Scout Executive, was selected by Gary as the one to make the Eagle pin presentation and other community notables will also be present and will help with the awards to the rest of the troop.
