Pep Boys Credit Newspapers for Outstanding Growth of Business

Newspapers were credited with a major role in the growth of The Pep Boys — Manny, Moe and Jack of California — to the position of one of the nation's largest retail auto supply chains, as the firm prepared this month to celebrate the 28th anniversary of the establishment of their first California stores.

"Newspapers have always carried the major share of Pep Boys' advertising — totalling more than 17,000 full pages since 1933 — and have contributed greatly to Pep Boys' steady growth," stated Murray Rosenfeld, executive vice president and general manager of the organization. "We look forward to accelerated use of this powerful medium in future years."

ROSENFELD came to Los Angeles in 1932 as a representative of The Pep Boys chain of automotive stores headquartered in Philadelphia, to open stores in an area that already showed promise of becoming the most important automotive market in the West.

"The depression was on then," Rosenfeld recalled, "and it took confidence to invest even in our two original stores located at Figueroa and Pico and 59th and Vermont, but we opened for business on Feb. 15, 1933. Today Pep Boys leads all auto supply retailers in California, both in number of stores and dollar volume."

6-Week Summer Classes Opening Here on June 26

Summer school classes in Torrance schools will be held for six weeks, from June 26 through Aug. 4, under action taken by the Board of Education.

High school courses will be offered in all subjects for which there is enough enrollment, with a continuation of high school offerings for eighth grade graduates who want to get a head start. All elementary schools will have classes, if there is sufficient enrollment.

Last year, some 8000 children — about one-third of the regular enrollment — went to summer school classes. These included more than 5600 elementary and 2300 high school students. About half of the high school enrollment was of eighth grades taking exploratory or advanced courses.

State apportionments, based on attendance, pay the costs of summer school.

Top Trumpet Virtuoso to Perform Here

Leonard B. Smith, America's premier cornet-trumpet virtuoso, will appear as guest artist with the Torrance Area Youth Band in a concert to be presented on Sunday afternoon, March 12th, at 4 p. m., in the El Camino College Campus Theater. This will mark the initial appearance of Smith in Southern California and his only concert here this season.

At the age of 19, Smith was engaged as cornet-trumpet soloist with the world famous Goldman Band of New York City. He later became first trumpeter with the Detroit Symphony and the Ford Sunday Evening Hour Orchestra. During the war years he played solo cornet with the United States Navy Band in Washington D. C.

At the present time Smith leads his own Belle Isle Band in Detroit and spends much of his time performing with bands and orchestras throughout the United States and Canada.

Smith's cornet-trumpet virtuosity is recorded on RCA Victor, Bandland and Grand Award's "Award Artist, Series" labels.

Tickets for this concert are being sold by the members of the Youth Band and by members of the Junior Youth Band. Tickets can also be obtained at the box office just prior to the concert.
