COOPERATIVE NURSERY SCHEDULES OPEN HOUSE HERE NEXT SATURDAY

Open house will be held next Saturday at the Torrance Nursery School, located at 4558 W. 182nd St., two blocks west of Hawthorne Blvd., according to Mrs. James Kimble, chairman of the event. Hours will be from 2 to 4 p. m.

The Torrance Nursery School is sponsored by the Adult Education Division of the Torrance Unified School District and although the program is designed primarily to aid parents in building a sound family relationship it also features a well equipped nursery school with 25 children attending four mornings each week.

MRS. KIMBLE expressed hope that all interested persons of the area would take advantage of the event and see the school with displays of work done by the children for a better understanding of the program. Refreshments will be served, she added.

Mrs. Milton Barter, the school's director, has spent many years in working with parents and their children and firmly believes that families gain a great deal through this type of education.

MORNING sessions are considered a laboratory experience for mothers who participate as teacher assistants under the guidance of a professional director. Fathers and mothers both attend the evening classes with all phases of child development covered. Parents are rotated giving them all a chance to participate in the program.
