Isen pointed out that the local YMCA succeeds or fails on the basis of this annual drive. Since the Torrance Y receives no Chest funds, the entire budget must be raised through Sustaining Memberships. During 1960, the local YMCA served more than 6000 locals boys and girls through 118 youth clubs and 16 separate sessions of camp. These statistics indicate that the Torrance YMCA operates the third largest youth program in the western states.

IF THE district includes two counties, each county shall have three members. If it includes three or more counties, each county shall have one member. In all cases, the members will be appointed by mayors and supervisors, not elected directly by the people.

Article 7 of the bill says: "A district may take any property necessary or convenient to the exercise of the powers granted in this chapter, whether the property is already devoted to the same use or otherwise."

REMELEYER wonders whether the city hall would be subject to capture. He concludes it would be.

Operating the metro plan will take money, so: (According to Article 9) "On or before the 15th day of June of each year, the council shall inform the board of supervisors of each county of the amount apportioned to the county. Each board of supervisors shall levy an ad valorem tax on taxable property, but not including intangible personal property, within the county included within the district, sufficient to secure the amount so apportioned to it and such taxes shall be levied and collected and paid to the treasurer of each of the counties to the credit of the district."


