Teaching Techniques Studied by Brazilian

A Brazilian kindergarten teacher visited Torrance kindergartens last week to learn how Americans teach their children.

Miss Leila Goncalves Liberato, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, visited kindergartens at Carr Elementary School and conferred with teachers Ann Broadwell and Marjory Brandt about techniques used in teaching youngsters the beginning of reading, writing, arithmetic and other subjects.

Kindergarten teaching in the two countries is quite similar, she reported, although America seems to have more material to work with. Although her school furnishes the money, she has to buy her own supplies, she told the American teachers.

Miss Liberato is in the U.S. as part of an exchange group of 13 Girl Scout leaders (they are called Girl Guides in Brazil). They are visiting for eight weeks learning about techniques used in Scout programs here. Last year, 13 Americans visited Brazil.

Since she is a kindergarten teacher, Miss Liberato also is visiting some schools. This is "summer vacation" time for her, since Brazil is located below the equator and has its seasons just reversed. School starts in March, lets out in June for the mid-winter vacation, starts again in August, and runs through December when it lets out for the summer.

Brazilian education differs from that in the U.S. in that those who can afford it attend private schools, while children of other families go to public schools. Public education is free only through the fifth grade, however, she said.

Brazilian high schools enroll only a small percentage of the children, she said, and there are no elective courses. Eleven subjects must be taken and passed by everyone, she reported. These include four languages—Portuguese (language of Brazil), French, Latin and English.

Miss Liberato teaches in a private school. After graduation from high school, prospective kindergarten teachers take three years of college, including teacher training courses. High school teachers take four years of college.

Brazilian education faces many of the same problems as does American education, she said.

In her spare time, Miss Liberato works with the Girl Guides. She is a leader in skills, arts, crafts, folk dancing, story telling, and swimming.

Although she is staying in Los Angeles, Miss Liberato's visit to Torrance was arranged through Mrs. Fran Heys, local resident and Girl Scout leader.
